FISHING BULLETIN

It is with great pleasure that once again, I will be responsible for our monthly fishing reports. I encourage all members to contact me regarding their outstanding catches and look forward to receiving your reports as we get into the 2005 season. We are already into the New Year and our weather has not settled into a typical wintertime pattern. If that is the case maybe we will get a reprieve and with our sights set on the springtime, the onset of cabin fever should not be that bad.

The New York Boat Show is under way at the Jacob Javits Center and this is an excellent venue to view new products and certainly new additions to our fishing arsenals. Now that the holidays are over it is a good time to unharness our reels from their rods and perform the proper maintenance. By doing this now you will be ready for the start of the season as well as insuring that you have trouble free operation. Changing frayed leaders on favorite lures and organizing tackle by taking an inventory of what we own are other things to do as a cure to the winter time doldrums.

On the local fishing front blackfishing continues at 17 Fathoms with very good catches being report-

ed. This should continue as the typical wintertime snow runoff has not effected this fishery yet. Several cod have been caught as well on these grounds adding an extra bonus to anglers. This is also the time of the year that the giant black seabass can be caught. Typically this involves a trip to the 50-80 mile wrecks that are found in 180-220 feet of water. If you find that a window of weather exists this is an excellent fishery to target as fish range in size from 3-6 lbs.

I will shortly be getting the dates out on our Annual Off Shore Codfish Trip. Stay tuned as last year we experienced fishing as good as it gets.
