
Incoming President's Message

Salt of the Earth Speakers

The FTC was graced with two local scallop captains, Captains Ed and Carl at our last general meeting. With humor, insight and pride these two men captivated the member audience with stories of the life of a scallop fisherman. Berthed at the Point Lookout commercial facility, they scour the ocean from 30-65 miles out all year for scallops. Dependent on the weather and cost of fuel to make a living, the latter has made it possible to turn a profit the last few months. Of course the weather can make the difference between a so-so year and a great year. When wind and seas exceed 25knts and 4 feet they sit at the dock. This year they have found a good vein of scallops off our shores and you will see them if you are working for inshore tuna about 25 miles out. In fact they are more than happy to share some scallop guts with those of us that work the scallopers area next season. They are generally in the prime BFT migration area. Although it would seem that they have a regular opportunity for this fishery it illegal for them to fish for tuna while holding a scallop permit. Oh well, it just leaves more fur us. We thank them for their time to share their stories with us, and hope they will join us for Thursday night barbeques.

The Reports of the Death of Loran C have been Greatly Exaggerated!

Not long ago the nails were being driven into the Loran coffin. Now Loran has been resurrected and even upgraded to enhanced e-Loran, an independent land based system. While the satellite based GPS has extreme targeted locating ability, it suffers from a serious shortcoming. It can be jammed by solar flares, which occur at the most in opportune time, and can shut down all navigation. E-Loran is being supported by the US government to be a reliable, dependable alternative and backup in case of the high frequency based GPS failure. Loran can provide stable, unjammable signals throughout the continental United States (CONUS), from ground level to above jet altitudes. It does not suffer from the line-of-sight limitations of VOR, DME or GPS. Loran's 100-KHz very low frequency signals do not require line of sight and can follow terrain contours and circumvent high-rise buildings. Loran is not so precise as GPS, but its one-third mile accuracy is better over a much larger area than any of the ground-based alternatives. And Loran's accuracy is improving; with demonstrated accuracy down to 10 to 15 meters (33 to 49 feet), which is about as good as GPS. Currently the Coast Guard maintains 19 e-Loran stations.

So for those of you who love the Loran lines for simplified fishing locations and simple love of tradition, you will not have to worry of its demise. Now you don't have to sacrifice good old-fashioned simplicity for state-of-the-art navigation technology. In fact there is new equipment soon to be on the market that will marry these two technologies.
