FISHING BULLETIN



It is again with great pleasure that I will be responsible for the monthly fishing reports for the 2010 season. I encourage all members to contact me regarding

their outstanding catches at the following e-mail address captharryweinblatt@yahoo.com . We are already into the new year, with scheduled events throughout the next two months, the month of March is just around the corner and so will begin the traditional commencement of our upcoming season in a new decade. So to get your mind off of the onset of cabin fever and help you cope for the next two months , I thought that it would be nice to recap the first half of our 2009 season in this bulletin and wrap up the second half in next months bulletin.

We had a lack luster start to our 2009 season unless you were on a codfish boat, and so started the "cod bite of the century" from the end of January for a solid two months the codfish settled upon a massive school of herring the took up residence in twenty fathoms of water south of Block Island. The results were unbelievable, although the fish were not giants most averaged 4-8lbs. Their were enough 12-15lbs fish that made it easy to settle the pool. Capt Scott Schafer aboard his Montauk based 50/50 made weekly trips when the weather allowed for limit catches. Dennis Cataldo reported a trip aboard a local Montauk Charterboat and a limit with the fish, reportedly a bit larger on that day up to the 20lb class.

The 2009 Winter Season was capped of by the annual trek of our FTC snow birds to their wintertime hibernating spot; Islamorada Florida. This year it was under full FTC attack as Club members Marvin Shapiro, Mike and Mary Ellen Zullo, Chris Bellinzoni, Larry Festa, Joe Fanora, Bobby Hindenlang, Mike Wagner, Bruce Forester and Richie Rosenkranz were present to fish both inshore and offshore. Besides happy hours and the most outrages sunsets at Lorilies Cabana Bar a variety of Snook, Mutton Snapper, Sheepshead, Spanish Mackerel, Cobia, Kingfish and Yellowtails were caught and released on a daily basis.

The month of March came in like a lion accompanied with lots of wind and rain it left like a lamb or as close to one as possible. I took advantage of a mild Saturday in March and hit several offshore wrecks the last stop producing an even dozen cod to 15lbs, a few pollack and quite a few baseball bat sized ling in 195 ft of water south east of Jones Inlet. Club members started to make their vessels ready for the upcoming season as the weather allowed and continued to moderate the later part of the month.

As the month of April came into view so did our local blackfish experts who fished feverishly right up until closing day. Mike Zullo and Bob Hindenlang reported excellent action with fish up to 12lbs. Paul Hilton reported that during a trip to the twenty fathom wrecks many smallish cod and seabass were caught. A stop inshore at the end of the day produced a limit of blackfish

for his cooler.

Our Annual FTC Cod Trip aboard the Viking Starship was another slam this year. The weather was absolutely phenomenal and although one had to work the rail to add fish to their coolers, Capt Steven Forsberg did not disappoint and once again it was FTC club comradery at its finest.

The month of April transitioned into May the fishing effort of our FTC members also started to intensify. Lower fuel prices helped that effort as our members were out and about making reports rather than waiting to hear about them. Our local striped bass action started with vengeance as Joe Mangiapanello was able to christen his new ride "Crazy G" along with club members Brian Dougherty and Tim Sherman. Chris Bellinzoni also skippered his "Kismet Joe" to some local hot spots for arm burning action on clam chummed striped bass. Our local bass fishing remained excellent this spring season due to the coolish weather which helped maintain the bay temperatures at a lower than normal temperature for well into the later spring season.

Seabass action was the best it had been in years and continued with reckless abandon along our local wrecks and reefs. Our fluke fishery opened and although it was non existent in the ocean it was red hot in the bay. Mike Wagner and Don Granger posted reports on some excellent trips they were having with fish up to 7.0 lbs hitting the scales. Out east the fluking was red hot as well, Anthony Testa along with his two boys reported a limit of fluke to 7.0 lbs as well.

Well it was an exciting start for sure. Stay tunned for the rest of the 2009 action which I will wrap up next month.

Fisherman to March on Washington , DC

Recreational and commercial fishermen, support business owners, families, and community leaders will gather at the steps of our Nation's Capitol on February 24, 2010 from noon to 3 PM to show congress a united front of the impacts caused by the unintended impacts of the Magnuson Stevens Conservation and Management Act as revised effective January, 2007 (RMSA). The overly restrictive management requirements created by the RMSA based on non scientific arbitrary deadlines are forcing anglers off the water, eliminating commercial fishing, preventing consumers from purchasing locally caught fresh seafood, destroying small family businesses, increasing unemployment, and adversely affecting coastal communities. Buses leaving from Long Island are in the works, information will be posted on our web site as it becomes available.

Loran C. Shutdown:

On October 28th, 2009 President Obama signed the Department of Homeland Security Appropriations Act directing the Coast Guard to discontinue Loran C not earlier than January 4th, 2010 once certain conditions were met. One of the major conditions was for the commandant of the Coast Guard to certify that termination of the Loran C signal "would not adversely impact the safety of maritime navigation". Commandant Thad Allen did just that on November 20th, 2009. In a November 30th "all hands" internal memo, Allen reportedly said plans were underway to execute the shutdown, and expressed his gratitude to all who had manned the system which came online in 1943. Current plans have the decommissioning to begin February 8th, 2010 extending through October 2010. If you have not converted your numbers you may be out of luck.
