Know your Knots Shock Leader to Line Ani-Knot Sust One basic knot which can be varied to meet virtually every knot tying need in either fresh or salt water fishing. That was the objective of Vic Dunaway, author of numerous books on fishing and editor of "Florida Sportsman" magazine. Here is the system which resulted. шш Leader to Line and LEADER TO LINE When leader is five times or more the pound/test of line, double ends of both leader and line back about 6". Slip loop of line through loop of leader far enough to permit tying Uni-Knot around both strands of leader 1. Tying on leader of no more than four times the pound/test of the line, double end of line and overlap with leader for about 6". Make Uni circle with doubled line. 2. With doubled line, tie Uni-Knot around the two stands of leader 2. Tie basic Uni-Knot, making Use only four turns. three turns around the two lines and snug up. 0227.5 and with an MITTING TO THE 2111117477777777 200 Put finger through loop of line and grasp both tag end and з. standing line to pull knot snug around loop of leader. 3. Now tie Uni-Knot with leader around double line. Again, use 4. With one hand pull standing leader (not both strands) With other hand pull both strands of line only three turns. (see arrows). Pull slowly until knot slides to end of מפקה הההות leader loop and all slippage is gone. W. _____ 4. Pull knots together as tightly 13 possible and trim ends and loop.

Fishing Report Out with the Old Season, In with the New!

The 2016 and the "Holiday" season have officially ended. This report is the hardest to write since there are few first hand reports submitted. While winter sets in up here on Long Island many will vacation in exotic locales, usually where good fishing exists. Your reports and photos will help us all get through the winter months so please share with your fellow FTC members by submitting to me via email, text, or phone. Contact information is below. Thanks to everyone who contributed in 2016 and a safe, healthy and happy New Year to all! 2016 wrapped up and 2017 began as follows:

Our New York blackfish or tautog season closed on December 15th. It was an interesting season from several perspectives. First off, water than normal water temps seem to delay the start. During the west end early season, many complained of keeper sized fish hard to come by and the overall number seemed down. The best fishing was occurring well west and south by the Shrewsbury rocks. As the waters cooled the action spread and the bite picked up in the traditional west end. Making headlines this fall were several real trophies. I personally received reports and pictures of 14, 15, 16 and even 20+ pounds (not by club members). Fish of this size were virtually unheard of years ago in Long island waters. Some attribute the presence of these fish to the vast artificial reef system that exists along the NJ coast. Some feel this reef system is providing a migration "highway" for the southern tog' (which generally grow faster and larger, due to a longer growing season) into our west end waters. Whatever the reason, these outsized blackfish are more readily available than in the past. Next year, target them to the west, with heavier tackle and white crabs and send photos for publication in this bulletin!

My own togging efforts the past couple of years have been mostly limited to short trips fishing the local wrecks and reefs outside of JI. This season, from my perspective, the best blackfish trips occurred just as the season was closing. In December, I had several trips with multiple limits caught. Some of the average sizes were good, with several fish around 8 lbs along with a mix of shorts up to nice chunky 4 and 5 pound fish.

Areas to the west and 17 fathoms came alive just as the recreational season was brought to a close. Traditionally, the best fishing I have seen usually occurs right around New Year's

in deep water areas like 17 Fathoms. Due to the early closure this is a distant memory for recreational fishermen. In my opinion, blackfish do require careful management but a season extension might be in order.

One of the highlights of the 2016 season was the tremendous offshore seabass fishing that occurred right up until the closing on January 1, 2017. Boats from New Jersey to Montauk targeted these fish on the deep wrecks and the numbers and size available were staggering. Giant porgies and a few cod rounded out the coolers. That fishery has now ended for the winter, with the seabass closing as of New Year's Day. That will put tremendous pressure on the cod grounds. Local cod fishing has begun, with the Capt Al reporting some decent fish. On a recent trip we had our first 2016/2017 "winter cod," fishing locally along with numerous short togs' (released). A lot of herring and mackerel are around, hopefully the cod will follow and we'll get a few productive trips in.

The last few years, bluefin tuna have been successfully targeted in the Hudson during late December and January. This year, an interesting report was brought to my attention "after the fact." It seems a small group of mostly west end boats were quietly targeting bluefin tuna in the Mud Hole West. Areas like Monster Ledge, Oil Wreck, Little Italy, held mixed sized fish from school sized up to 300 lbs for a couple of weeks during middle December. Fish were caught on both bait and jigs. Supposedly lots of bait in that area during that time. This was about the best tuna action I heard of during all of 2016.

Property Business Manager's Report

Happy New Year! There are a few outstanding payments due for winter storage so please send in your payment as soon as possible. The summer lease agreements for 2017 will be mailed shortly. The rate for 2017 remains at \$78 a foot with no minimum. All owners leasing a slip will be charged an additional \$175 if storing a trailer on the property. Freezers are \$175. A deposit of \$300 is required with your signed lease. In order to secure you slip for the 2016 season your deposit and signed lease must be received on or before February 15, 2017. You will receive two invoices for the balance owed, one due on April 1st and the second payable on May 31st. Before your Vessel can be in the Marina you will need to supply an updated insurance policy to the Property Business Manager. Please let me know if you are not renewing your lease so I can guickly determine which slips will be available. Any member interested in a slip should contact me as soon as possible. Our goal is to keep the marina full!


