

Fishing Grinds to a Halt

Happy New Year to All! The weather always drives our fishing and it's fair to say that what started out as a mild winter has now turned into a cold stretch to remember with snow again in the forecast later this week. The tautog, striped bass and sea bass seasons have wound down. Looks like the weather will break next week and hopefully some cod will appear on the west end.

Striped bass obliged right until the season closure after December 15th. The late run saw smaller but mixed sized fish, with herring and mackerel in the mix. Dogfish became a nuisance, even on the jigs. I enjoyed some stupid fast "drop to the bottom and then you got-em" catch and release jigging with the school bass right in front of the JI West End jetty. I put on a mackerel tree and had bass, macks and herring on the tubes. Huge pods of bass and bait. It was a banner fall run of bass, very encouraging for the future.

Blackfish or tautog fishing left many largely disappointed this fall. I scraped together a few limits but it was tough. Some sharp commercial guys I know and the party boat skippers were scratching their heads, particularly to the west. 17 Fathoms never seemed to turn on and then the severe winter weather hampered the efforts of the commercial fleet. Maybe the fish caught a break. I believe we may be seeing even stricter regulations going forward. The east end enjoyed great tog' fishing, go figure.



A few cod mixed in with the mostly lackluster blackfish catches. Bob Bohlert and soon to be FTC member Kevin Carmody took Bob's *Joint Effort* in search of some tautog. They found nothing but dogfish out at Cholera. Moving inshore to a 55' wreck, they managed a nice 13 lb. cod, a keeper black, along with some shorts. They cut the day short due to deteriorating conditions. I was surprised they went that particular day. Great effort by the *Joint Effort*! Another friend fished a blackfish jig on a local reef. His first three fish (on the jig) were all keeper sized cod. On the west end, every cod I have heard of this year was a keeper, with nice fish up to 20 lbs, caught on some of the shallowest wrecks. I did try one trip out to 100' of water and worked my way in. Nothing but dogs on that particular day, shallow or deep, plus lot's of short tog. When the weather ever breaks, I'll be at the cod once again. Offshore seabass continued strong, right until the end. That fishery is now closed, until further notice.

2017 had its ups and downs depending on who you spoke to and where they fished. Offshore, a disaster for most, with a few good rounds with mixed Bluefin early on. Let's hope the offshore 2017 was an anomaly. Inshore, the east end always has the edge, but this year seemed to enjoy a particularly

big edge on shark, fluke, seabass and blackfish. Weakfish appear to be on an upswing, showing up in some of the traditional spots. Many adult sized weaks seemed to join the seabass and porgies on the offshore wrecks during their migrations. Weakfish may make a good appearance next year.

Bill and Theresa Morrogh weighed in from sunny warmer Florida. Bill made four trips out of Stuart on a friend's 35' Henriques. The four trips tallied 3-5-0-2 on sailfish hookups. Lots of mahi, some kingfish and wahoo round out the catch along with tons of Spanish mackerel. Bill reports Dee Toohey had a nice 4 pound southern flounder taken on their boat last week. Sounds like the Morroghs and Tooheys are enjoying the fishing scene down in Florida and promise to send some pictures for next month. Bill used to mention living vicariously through my own winter fishing reports, now the shoe is on the other foot!

What will 2018 hold? You won't know unless you go out and try it! Please share your results with our membership. Especially warm water reports to help get us through the winter! Please send reports and pictures for inclusion in your club bulletin. Thanks to all who contribute, we need more of you to chime in. Happy New Year!

Property Manager's Report

Happy New Year! There are a few outstanding payments due for winter storage so please send in your payment as soon as possible. The summer lease agreements for 2018 will be mailed in early January. The rate for 2018 remains at \$78 a foot with no minimum. All owners leasing a slip will be charged an additional \$175 if storing a trailer on the property. Freezers are \$175. A deposit of \$300 is required with your signed lease. In order to secure you slip for the 2018 season your deposit and signed lease must be received on or before February 15, 2018. You will receive two invoices for the balance owed, one due on April 1st and the second payable on May 31st. Before your Vessel can be in the Marina you will need to supply an updated insurance policy to the Property Business Manager. Please let me know if you are not renewing your lease so I can quickly determine which slips will be available. Any member interested in a slip should contact me as soon as possible. Our goal is to keep the marina full!





Know your Knots Fly to Tippet

Thread tippet through the hook eye and pull out about six inches. Make five turns around the standing part with the tag end of the tippet. Push end through the loop created in front of the hook eye, then bring the end back through the big loop just formed. Wet the knot and pull steadily on the tippet to tighten the wraps against the hook eye. Trim.




