


I ask all of the members that are interested, please consider joining a committee, there will be more information about them all and who the chairs are at the January GM, see everyone then.

## STRIPER DIARIES | EPISODE 9

I would like to thank the members of the Freeport Tuna Club, and the editors of the Tuna Tower News, for giving me the opportunity to chronicle my fishing adventures this past year. It has been an honor sharing my knowledge and experiences with all of you.

As winter sets in and the temperatures start to plummet, I try to spend most weekends in my garage doing my annual "tackle check." The first thing is to start with your reels. There are several great reel cleaning and maintenance kits. I prefer Ardent Reel Kleen Cleaning Kit. It has everything you need to get your favorite reel in "like new" condition. It is also a good time to strip old line down to the backing so it will be ready for new line in the spring. Loosen the drag on the reel too. Rod care is equally important. Each winter we wipe down every rod. I use a non-abrasive soap on the cork and a protectant like Bow to Stern on the rods. Check each guide with a cotton Q-tip for abrasions and replace bad guides. This next one is probably the most important -- review your log book. Log books provide a wealth of information. Look for patterns, review water temperatures and dial in on which spots consistently produced fish. Things change over time, especially in the back bays, where new shoals have developed since Hurricane Sandy. I can vividly remember fishing in spots behind Sea Dog Creek, that are simply too shallow to navigate now unless on a Moon Tide.

It is also a great time to mark your calendars for the upcoming fishing shows. The first event that I attend is the Tri State Fishing Expo, held on January 4, 2020, at the Hilton Hotel located at 1100 South Avenue, Staten Island, NY. Although it's a road-trip, there are new and used fishing and outdoor equipment at great prices, along with raffles and seminars. The show runs from 8am to 2pm and is a bargain at a \$10.00 admission fee. For our members who love to surf fish, "Striper Day" is held on January 19, 2020. It takes place at the Ward Melville High School, located in East Setauket. This event hails itself as the "largest surf fishing expo" around filled with local vendors, factory representatives, well known authors, guides and local plug builders. It starts at 8:30am and ends at 3:30pm. Don't be late - the first 500 attendees receive a free goody bag from the sponsors! Next stop for me is always the New York National Boat show, held at the Jacob Javits Convention Center. This year the event takes place from January 22-26, 2020. The hours are from 12 noon to 9pm Wednesday, Thursday and Friday; Saturday 10am - 9pm; Sunday 10am-6pm. Don't miss out! Finally, for our fly fisherman, the "Fly fishing Show" in Edison, New Jersey, at the New Jersey Convention Center runs from January 24 - 26, 2020. This event is filled with seminars, classes, demos and special events. Stay tuned for the list of upcoming events for February!

Finally, you can never go wrong with simply jumping on a plane and heading to Islamorada, Florida. That will definitely cure a case of the winter blues. I will be traveling down the week of February 24, 2020; with Pete Cefai, and staying at the Islander Resort. If any club members want to meet for a day of fishing or simply a grab cocktail at Lorelei's Restaurant and Cabana Bar, be sure to give us a call.






