ICCAT takes a bite out of make fishing

NO HARVEST RULE FOR 2022-2023

If your club is currently in the planning stages for a 2022 make tournament, you can stop right there as there will be no make harvest allowed along the East Coast for the next two years.

The United States and other countries from around the world tackled management challenges for Atlantic tunas and sharks at the 2021 annual meeting of the International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas (ICCAT) that concluded on November 23.

On the plus side, commission members adopted a measure for Western Atlantic bluefin tuna with a total catch limit of 2,726 metric tons resulting in a quota increase of more than 5% for U.S. fishermen. This increased fishing opportunity for bluefin tuna is consistent with scientific advice allowing for a moderate increase in catch while having a high probability of avoiding overfishing and providing for the sustainability of the fishery.

According to NOAA Fisheries, ICCAT will continue working to finalize its management strategy evaluation for bluefin tuna. Those holding an HMS Permit can expect to see a series of stakeholder workshops scheduled sometime in 2022.

The bad news coming out of ICAAT is that a two-year retention ban is being implemented starting in 2022 on North Atlantic shortfin make shark which ICCAT called "overfished." According to NOAA Fisheries, the ban on make harvest also contains strong provisions to improve data reporting, and particularly, the catch reporting of live releases and fish discarded dead, by all ICCAT parties.



Striper Diaries Episode 35

As the season has come to an end, it's time to reflect on the incredible fishing trips we had in 2021. I want to thank the board of directors and tuna club members for allowing me to chronicle my fishing adventures. It has been a blessing to share my knowledge and my experiences on the water. This past year was extra special because of the inshore Cobia and Bluefin bite in our backyard. By mid July, the Cobia bite was red hot with schools of fish mixed in the bunker pods. Most fish landed were in the 40 plus pound range. By the end of July, small bluefin and mahi moved into the

15-20 mile range, and by August word got out of the giant bluefin bite off the beach. In mid- September the Spanish Mackerel moved into our inlet. Casting epoxy jigs and deadly dicks did the trick. By October it was time to head to Montauk. As usual, the

Mecca produced large sea bass, trigger fish, jumbo porgies, striped bass and false albacore.

Lucky for us, the trophy bluefin stayed in our backyard feeding on blue fish and bunker and remained

in our area until the end of December. They were so close, we even re-named the Rockaways "Ambrose Canyon." I can't remember a time when I loaded the boat with mojos and tuna gear, only to steam out 10 minutes from the dock. We were also treated with incredibly warm air temperatures which allowed fishing right through the end of December... and the striped bass remained off our beaches until closing day. I was lucky enough to spot the tuna on December 15, 2021 while striped bass fishing. Tuna chasing bait and crashing next to the boat in only in 50ft of water! That was an incredible site... and we were almost lucky enough to land one (threw the tuna popper, line came tight and them unbuttoned). It

doesn't get better than

that!!

Let's hope 2022 is great a fishing season for all our members. Happy New Year to every-



KNOW YOUR HOOKS

Today's sophisticated sportsman knows that there's a lot more to catching fish than just tying any type hook to the line. Hooks just may be the most important part of your arsenal, and if you skimp in this area, your results may suffer accordingly.

That's why it's important to find the hooks that work best for you, and stick with them. Hook size is determined by its pattern, and is given in terms of the gap widths in the hook. The two important dimensions of the hook are its gap and throat, as illustrated by the Mustad-Viking hook below.

Note the width of the gap, clearance between point and shank and the depth of its throat. These generous dimensions make for a bigger bite, deeper penetration and better holding power.
