FISHING BULLETIN

I oday the ground hog will hop shadow. If he does then our v has six weeks left. Although we been brutally battered by our winter, I am sure we all have I enough of this type of weather. Let's hope that we can put some stock in that report and that spring- time is just around the



corner. In retrospect we have generally enjoyed a relatively mild winter. The rest of February and March will tell the tale.

On the fishing front the only decent report was just recently from Montauk. Paul Hilton along with his buddy fished aboard a party boat and was treated with very decent cod action. He reported that the 25 anglers on board caught 130 keeper cod. The pool fish was in the 15lb range and many throwbacks were reported as well. Upon hearing that report former club President, Scott Schafer sailed his vessel to the cod grounds and reported a slow pick with fish up to 12lbs.

Our local action has shut down completely as is typical

for this time of the year. The local water temperatures are low and the most recent snowfall will not help out, as the run off will further cool down the area waters.

The offshore wrecks continue to yield decent numbers of seabass, pollack & hake. The problem getting to these grounds has been the continued high winds. Our codfishing has not taken hold and I hope that we can expect a few fish to be caught in the springtime, which has been the case the last several seasons.

Our Annual Freeport Tuna Club Codfish Trip, sailing from Montauk aboard the Viking Star has a list of anglers already signed up and should be sold out shortly. If you are thinking about signing up you should do so now as the trip will be limited to 35 anglers. The trip is scheduled to leave on Friday evening April 15th and return Sunday evening April 17th. The fare is \$ 210.00 per person and if you were on board for last years trip then you know what it is all about.

CONSERVATION

Who said "You can't tell the players without a score card". This has never been more accurate than it is now regarding our fisheries. It seems as if every year each specie lines up to take it's turn at arbitration before the government. These are the current regulations on the fish who have gone through the process for 2005.

Flounder 11", minimum 15 fish bag limit. Opens 3rd Saturday in March and closes June 30th and remains closed until 2006. Blackfish 14" minimum 10 fish bag limit. Open until May 31st. Closed June 1st to Sept 30th and reopening on October 1. Striped Bass 28" minimum, 1 fish.

The Hudson River limit was increased to 24" from 18". No trebles with bait are allowed in the Hudson and circle hooks are recommended. Albany will decide soon if we will have a second striped bass at 40" or greater. The season opens April 15th and closes December 16th. Bluefish are open all year with a limit of 10 and we can go to 15 if anyone believes that is necessary! Porgies to be finalized but the regs. Will be more liberal than last year. There will be no 2 week Summer or Fall closure.

SeaBass 12" limit. 25 fishlimit open without any 2 week Summer/Fall closure. Fluke - The MRAC has recommended 1 171/2 size limit with a 5 fish bag limit. The exact dates are not official yet, but it appears the season will open 4/29 or 5/1 and stay open until 10/31.
