Although it has recently gotten cold, I am sure we all have had enough and those six weeks canit come soon enough. With that said I hope everyone has been keeping busy by either attending the local boat shows and sporting shows or by making their tackle ready for the upcoming season.


On the local fishing front, the lack of snow and the after effects of run off have kept the blackfishing red hot. Most recently Capt. Grover Howell, Capt. Bob Schmidt and Capt. Paul Marcy have posted reports that tell the tale, excellent blackfishing, with fish reported to 10lbs. When the wind has not been a major factor the boats that have been able to sail have been enjoying a very good itogî season to date.

The offshore wrecks continue to produce quality seabass. For the boats that have been sailing to the wrecks in the 30-35 fathoms of water, the fishing could not be better. Recently I stopped in to Sea-Isle and was met by Angela Feuring, she had come back from a recent trip aboard a local head boat and said it was the best seabass trip that she had ever had. Double headers were common throughout the day, that's good fishing. Cod fishing has not taken hold as of yet but the reports from up north are optimistic. Maybe this year they will head a little further south and west and we can enjoy what was once a very bountiful winter fishery.

Our Annual FTC Offshore Cod Trip is all set and rapidly approaching being sold out. The dates are set for a departure the evening of April 20th and arriving the evening of April 22nd. We will be sailing from Montauk aboard the Viking Starship, with Capt. Steven Foresberg at the helm. The fare for this much awaited event is \$ 235.00. - February 10, 1722-Infamous and notorious pirate, Bartholomew Roberts- aka Black Bart, died at sea off the coast of Guinea.


## Get Dressed!
