FISHING BULLETIN



Captain Harry Weinblatt F/V Blue Marlin

The other day the ground hog saw his shadow, according to that myth we have another six weeks of winter left. If what we have been experiencing so far to date is considered winter, let it continue. This has been one of the mildest winters that I can remember in the last several years. The favorable weather has also lent a very helping hand to the dock builders who are feverishly working at the club property on our new bulkhead.

On the local fishing front, I am excited to report that, I have been receiving reports from our local cod fishery, that is correct local cod. The last good cod season we have had out of our local inlet according to my log was during the winter of 1996. If you remember correctly and were listening attentively during the October GM, our guest speaker that evening Captain Al Lindroth, predicted that we would have a good cod season this year.

He based that on information he had heard regarding Caplin or Ocean Smelt. The report was that those baitfish stocks were in good health and his prediction was right on the money. There is something to be said about having years of experience and he is a testament to that. The first captain to get in on the action was Paul Hilton aboard his Emily S, accompanied by Don Granger all they needed was a few hours to put a twenty plus fish catch together. Later that week he did a repeat performance accompanied by Bob Hindenlang and Joe Fanora, they kept a total of thirty fish releasing as many. Capt. Jim Krug aboard his Persuader II also got in on the action, fishing inshore pieces he and his crew kept a total of fifteen fish. This past weekend Capt. John Jutt sailed his vessel in glass like conditions, accompanied by Don Granger once again, they boated a respectable nineteen fish. These fish are all school sized, with the largest reported short of the ten pound mark. Blackfish to five and six pounds as well as Mud Hake or Ling have also been caught on the same grounds.

From the east end I have heard that the cod fishing has gotten off to a fairly decent start. There are good signs to date and everyone I have spoken to is very optimistic about the upcoming spring run.

Now the final word is in for our Annual Offshore Codfish Trip. The dates are set for a departure on the evening of Friday April 11 and returning on Sunday evening April 13. We will be sailing aboard the Viking Starship this year. The fare for this much-awaited event is \$ 275.00 per person. If you are thinking about joining us you should sign up now, as the trip will be limited to 40 anglers. If you have been on board for any of the last several years then you know what it is all about. I will be collecting payment in full at the upcoming GM so please see me.
