FISHING BULLETIN



Captain Harry Weinblatt E/V Blue Marlin

In a few days the ground hog will come out and will he see his shadow? If he does then according to that very fabled myth we will have another six weeks of winter left. Although we have had our share of cold temperatures since the winter season has begun, I am sure we all have had enough and these six weeks can't come soon enough. With that said I hope everyone has been keeping busy by either attending the local boat shows and sporting shows or by making their tackle ready for the upcoming season. If cabin fever has set in then the 27th Annual New York Sportfishing Federation Forum and Auction might just be the cure for that. The dates are set for February 13th, 14th and 15th at the Freeport Recreation Center. This is a must attend event, Capt. Larry Festa will be conducting his infamous Sharking Seminar and I will be conducting a presentation on Canyon Tuna Fishing. If you want to know where the tuna fish were swimming last season I will let the cat out of the bag during this seminar.

On the local fishing front, the after effects of snow, which we better know as "run off" have slowed the blackfishing as of late. The inshore wrecks seem to be barren of life since the local areas water temperatures are hovering around forty degrees and any life on them are proportedly in a catatonic state.

The offshore wrecks continue to produce quality seabass, slammer sized pollack and a handful of cod. The head boats that have been sailing to the wrecks in the 30-35 fathoms of water have reported excellent fishing. Even though the wrecks have been getting hammered every week the fish continue to fill in on them and all of the boats are reporting limit catches for all anglers. Cod fishing has taken hold, however the fishing is not of the quality as it was last year in our local area waters. The reports from out east are a totally different story, that is 180 degrees different. The reports from Montauk which are only four days old are that a "red hot" bite has started and it looks like we can expect to see a repeat of last year.

I recently had an opportunity to team up with fellow FTC members, Bob Hindenlang, Paul Hilton, John Jutt and two other friends aboard Capt. Scott Schaefer's Montauk based vessel 50/50. The information he received from his sources indicated that the cod bite was on. We departed Montauk harbor at 3:00AM, next stop south of Block Island. We arrived in the dark and Scott put us on "the numbers" after two quick drifts and a half dozen cod lying in the cockpit he decided to anchor up. I gently slipped the anchor over the side and when we came tight, all hell broke loose. We absolutely hammered the cod up to fifteen pounds keeping our legal limit and releasing the rest. Final tally for the day was one hundred seventy fish. The majority were between five and eight pounds and many nice cod in the ten to twelve pound range rounded out the catch. In my thirty five years of local cod fishing, this trip was the best one I ever had and to boot we were done fishing by 9:30AM.

Our Annual FTC Offshore Cod Trip is all set and rapidly approaching being sold out. The dates are set for a departure from Montauk the evening of April 17th and arriving back in Montauk the evening of April 19th. This year we will be sailing aboard the new 120 foot Viking Superstar, with Capt. Steven Forsberg at the helm. The fare for this much awaited event is \$ 250.00. If you have any interest in joining us then please sign up now as the trip will be strictly limited to 35 anglers and will be sold out in short order. If you signed up and have given me a deposit, I will be collecting the balance of any monies that are due at the upcoming February General meeting so please see me.

NOAA Fisheries issued a press release last month praising the contributions recreational anglers make to the nation's economy: 82 billion dollars in total sales, which generated 24 billion dollars in income and supported 534,000 jobs nationwide. To put this in perspective, this is more than twice the number of people employed by Ford, Chrysler and General Motors combined. You might think with those kinds of numbers we would get more respect from the regulators; instead we get stricter limits and shorter seasons. No official decision have been published yet, but it seems likely that for 2009 the fluke season will be shorter than last year, with a similar minimum size and possibly a bag limit of 2 fish. On another note, NOAA also reports that despite a call from scientists for a significant reduction in the number of bluefin tuna taken in the eastern Atlantic and Mediterranean the only reduction approved was a 300 metric ton reduction from the western Atlantic stock, i.e. the fish in American waters. It is now a proven fact that bluefin travel from American to European waters; therefore this decision forces us to conserve fish on our side of the ocean so that they can be caught by the Europeans!

The New York Sportfishing Federation show is coming to the Freeport Recreation Center on February 13, 14 and 15. There will be great seminars including Capt. Larry Festa and Capt. Harry Weinblatt on Saturday, February 14. There will be great discounts and a giant auction on Sunday at 2:30. Come support the Federation and the fight to win the fluke lawsuite.

Also, the Canyon Runner Sportfishing Seminar is being held on February 28 at the Huntington Hilton. Tickets are available at a 20% discount for FTC members–call 732-842-6825 and mention the discount for FTC members.
