STRIPER DIARIES EPISODE 27

MEMORIES. With snowy winter blues setting in, the dog days of summer seem like a distant memory. One thing that brings me joy is reminiscing about fishing. I was fortunate enough that both parents were diehard fisherman and we traveled the globe in search of the next best fish-

ing spot. One place in particular with exceptional fishing was a tiny village off the coast of Belize. This Caribbean country is nestled in the northeast coast of Central America and runs parallel with the second largest barrier reef - a quarter mile off the beach. After a direct flight to the mainland, we were ushered to an outside runaway to wait for the next "puddle jumper." The flight to our hotel lasted only 20 minutes and the view was incredible. After settling in, we fished from tiny panga boats and the bright blue water was filled with bonefish, permit, tarpon, snook, barracuda, and local reef fish including snapper, grouper and jacks. With temperatures throughout the year averaging 84 degrees and southeasterly trade winds throughout most of the year, this gem is a must visit.

Our next stop was Roatan. Roatan is an island in the Caribbean, about 40 miles off the northern coast of Honduras. It is approximately 48 miles long and only 5 miles across at its widest point and rests on an exposed ancient coral reef which rises to about 270 meters. After settling in, our first trip was at a pristine snorkel spot called Star Fish Alley, where the crystal blue waters were filled with a diverse mixture of breathtaking coral reefs, indigo hamlets and a wide variety of cushion sea stars. Our fishing trips consisted of reef fishing with bait and trolling for wahoo and tuna. This undiscovered village should be on every bucket list.

Finally, my absolute favorite place and one I like to call home is Rancho Leonero at Los Cabos. The towns Los Barriles, Rancho Leonero, and Buena Vista are located 42 miles north of the Los Cabos Airport. The road is a paved highway, about half the way there and then turns

into dirt. Do not attempt this road in the rainy season, you will not make - - I know from personal experience. The East Cape of Baja California is a very special place. The fishing is along the Sea of





Cortez and the coastline is spectacular... white sand beaches, majestic mountains and sweeping deserts. I have visited the East Cape in the spring, summer, and early fall. The fishing is phenomenal, from marlin, dorado, tuna, wahoo and the incredible rooster

fish just to name a few. If you ever get a chance Rancho Leonero is a very special place.

Although we may not be traveling anytime soon, reminiscing to simpler times brings me joy.


