FISHING

ith less than three weeks until spring. The time cannot pass by quickly enough. After a taste of mild temperatures during January and only one major snowstorm, this past winter has been a pleasure as compared to others. As the month of March settles in we should start to see a little moderation in weather, hopefully enough

for us to start to work on our boats. March and April always have a surprise for us, so we are not out of the woods yet. The areas waters have not cooled down to prior years levels so I am optimistic that we will have a strong spring fishery.

On the local fishing front the only report I have gotten recently has been from Scott Schafer aboard his 50/50. On a recent Presidents Day trip out of Montauk, the crew of the father and son team Jim and Bobby Krug and Scott fished a few local drops for a small catch of Cod and Ling. The rest of the Montauk fleet has also reported that the cod fishing has gotten off to a slow start. CONSERVATION

Last week the Atlantic State Marine Fisheries Commission voted to oppose Addendum XVIII on summer flounder. This is the best possible news we could have received. It means we will not have to take a 38% cut in our 2006 Fluke allocation for New York. Fears of 2 fish at 19 inches can be put to rest. There will be some reduction but it should only be in the 10% to 15% range. This has not yet been transferred into a size and bag limit. I will advise you as the allocations are released.

There is a bill in the Senate to eliminate all NOAA weather radio broadcasts. This is a service we are already paying for. I believe this would be a dangerous disservice if it were allowed to happen. NY Senators Schumer & Clinton can help prevent this along with our Long Island Congressman. There is much local opposition to this bill, however; if it builds momentum I will ask the board for permission to organize club opposition.

latest newsletter. This is a subject I have written about frequently. The simple facts are: Cost over \$500 million dollars to heat 42,000 homes while saving 13.5 million barrels of oil over 20 years. It seems very expensive for very little benefit with a conservation benefit equal to roughly one days oil use.

The bill to ban beach access is still being fought by a coalition of may organizations and fishing clubs.

A lawsuit was filed in the Eastern District Court in Islip by the United Boatmen and other organizations. The suit names NMFS and ASMFC in an injunction to stop the imposition of fluke regulations in NY State. The basis for the suit rests with the agencies not taking economic impact into consideration while using data they openly admit was never intended to be used for the purpose of setting these quotas.
