

FISHING BULLETIN

The beginning of March is already behind us. With less than three weeks until spring, our clocks will be set one hour ahead giving us a tease of what we have in store, more hours of daylight. After a taste of mild temperatures throughout our winter season to date and one minor snowstorm, this past winter has been a pleasure as compared to others. As the month of March continues to settle in we should start to see a little moderation in weather, hopefully enough for us to start to work on our boats. March and April always have a surprise for us, so we are not out of the woods yet. The areas waters have not cooled down to prior years levels and with a taste of mild southerly breezes recently, I am optimistic that this will help to jump start our spring fishery.

On the local fishing front, the reports from the local cod fishery are that they continue to be caught, however not in the same numbers that we were experiencing when the run first commenced. Most recently Paul Hilton skippered his Emily S, accompanied by crewmembers John Jutt, Raymond Jutt and Nick Nero, to an area southeast of our inlet in twenty fathoms of water. They picked away at the Cod, Blackfish and Ling and managed to put together a decent catch, which was evidenced by the bags of fillets that the crew walked off the boat with. Largest Cod reported that day was around the 10lb. range.

Our Annual Offshore Codfish Trip is currently open to non-club members. If you are onboard for the trip and would like to bring someone else who is not a member, please see me at the upcoming GM. The dates are set for a departure on the evening of Friday April 11 and returning on Sunday evening April 13. We will be sailing aboard the Viking Starship this year. Ed Schuh is out of the hospital and at home recovering. We also wish him a speedy recovery.


