The first day of spring is just three weeks away. Last week's foot of snow might keep us wondering how far away those three weeks really are. They say that March comes in like a lion and leaves like a lamb. The current weather trends might be indicative that there is some stock to be taken for believing in "old wives tales". Although spring might be in the air we are not out of the woods just yet, March and even April have a surprise so let hope that old man winter can start to relax his grip on us "reel" soon.

On the local fishing front our cod action remains to be a viable option for those willing to brave the winter elements. I skippered the Blue Marlin twice within the last three weeks to wrecks deeper than twenty fathoms and most of these pieces are holding school sized cod in the 4-6 lb class. Lots of small fish but enough legal sized ones to make the effort worthwhile.

The local cod action off of Montauk continues with reckless abandon. Although there are days when the fish do not bite as well as the day before, there are many more good days than bad ones so it is worth the trip if you haven't tried yet.

Our FTC in Islamorada sent in the following report."Winter locals" of Mike Wagner, Joey "stach" Fanora, Bob Hindenlang and Mike Zullo have been regularly fishing Mike's Stamas on the patch reefs off of Islamorada and have been picking away at the Yellowtail and occasional Hog Snappers. Sportfishing catch & release on all you want Grouper of several species...Black, Strawberry and Gag as grouper season under a closure moratorium.

Bruce Forster and Chris Bellinzoni fished with Capt Bruce Pollock of Edge Charters five days last week on the patch reefs for yellowtail & grouper with good catches. Every drop offering keeper size grouper. We also fished the back country with arm dreary bites of Spanish mackerel, Lady Fish, and Snappers of various species, Blue runners, plus Black Tip Sharks and Lemon Sharks. The sail fish bite further offshore has also been hot. Last week's Poor Girls Tournament out of Islamorada had 30 boats raise and catch 48 sails. The winning boat had 8. Kings and cobias are also part of the off-shore action. The weather and winds have been very tough down there this year, temps only in the low 60 most days and a relentless wind of 15-20 knots have been the norm.

Lastly, Our Annual FTC Off-Shore Fishing Extravaganza is sold out. If you interested in signing up for this event, I have started a waiting list. Inevitably something comes up and a spot or two have opened up in the past. Please let me know if you wish to have your name added to this list.
