FISHING REPORT

THE FISHING CAN ONLY IMPROVE

As I write this it is sunny and 55, not bad for February 28th. The northeast, in general, has experienced a relatively mild winter with a few notable storms. It seems like we have had a lot of wind though, and this had made fishing reports of any type hard to come by.

Locally, the only reports are from the Capt Al and they report a limited amount of "catching" going on, with just a handful of cod and ling on the good days. Some of the Shinnecock boats had some decent trips recently with cod and pollock. They have deep water closer to shore and I'm guessing those fish were caught in at least 150' of water.

Montauk has been slow, again weather being a major factor in getting off the dock. Hopefully a run of spring cod will develop east and west.

A quick glance at the 44025 Weather Buoy shows water temps above 40. The water never go that cold so things may break open early. Other than cod, pollock, and ling, our options are extremely limited, particularly with Spring blackfish season no longer an option and winter flounder so scare.

So what lies ahead in the near term? Looking through the current regulations I see winter flounder would be up first opening on April 1st and running through May 30th with a 2 fish bag limit. From Raritan Bay all the way east to Shinnecock Bay, winter flounder fishing is so poor that few are targeting them. Will 2016 be any better? The only way to find out is to try. There is talk of greatly extending the season since so few are actually being caught. This might be a good thing since fishing in the ocean for winter flounder has become quite successful and popular in New Jersey and the same opportunities exist for New York Anglers and it would add a couple of fish to the coolers during seasonal closures of other species.

Striped Bass would open next, starting April 15 and running through December 15th. One fish at greater than 28" per angler, status quo from 2015 I believe. April 15th options for bass are pretty much limited to soaking worm or clam baits in western LI sound, possibly Jamaica Bay too. We will need to be patient in this neck of the woods. The earliest fish usually show along the beach, presenting jigging opportunities or clam bellied in south shore inlets.

Options provided below are subject to change and approval by the NYSDEC and various bodies of the ASMFC.

is fluke and the season opener is greatly anticipated. The most recent regulation I saw had status quo, or nearly so with a season running approximately May 17th to

September 21st. The dates may be adjusted to align with weekends. 5 fish per angler with an 18" minimum size. I think this size and season worked well for western south shore anglers, let's hope they don't mess with it too much.

Another possible option is if the mackerel show up this spring. This gives everyone a chance to shakedown their boats, bend a rod, and fill the freezer with great bait. Fingers crossed on this one, maybe this will be the year they return for a traditional spring run.

SEABASS ARE POPULAR

Seabass have become increasingly popular due to their abundance, good eating qualities, and availability as bycatch while targeting fluke over rough bottom. Despite this abundance of seabass in our waters someone feels that they are in decline and being overfished. A reduction in



harvest by approximately 23% is being considered, some options for achieving this are shown in the table below:

Last years (2015) limits are highlighted above, NYDEC is looking for angler input as to the preferred options for 2016. One way I know to cast your vote is on the Noreast Saltwater web site. Too bad none of the options have an earlier season opener, we've had some huge seabass during early ocean forays for fluke in May and June. Unfortunately, without proper venting of the swim bladder, seabass release mortality is very high. Maybe let us keep a few even earlier than mid – late July?

That's about all for now. My boat is ready to go, just need to obtain some bait and will hopefully test the waters soon!

There's nothing like first hand reports. Many FTC members take fishing vacations to warmer climates, please consider sharing your fishing tales and pictures with our membership by sending them in.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Just a reminder for all those who have boats at the property for storage, in water or on land. Do not leave heaters and or battery chargers plugged in without being attended to. No overnight electrical devices are to be left on. Unattended electrical devices cause most marina fires during the winter months. On other note, only approved marine electrical cords are allowed. Hardware store extension cords are not aloud and will be unplugged if found. Your cooperation is appreciated.

PROPERTY BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT

The status on the marina is as follows: 22 slips have been confirmed with deposits, 4 members have told me that their check is in the mail, 3 captains from last year have not committed. That leaves at least 2 slips available. The rate for 2016 has been reduced to \$78 a foot with no minimum. All owners leasing a slip will be charged an additional \$175 if storing a trailer on the property. Freezers are \$175. Please let me know if you are not renewing your lease so I will know if more than 2 slips are available. Any member interested in a slip should contact me as soon as possible. Our goal is to fill the marina!




