MARCH COMES IN LIKE A LAMB

As the saying goes March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb. However, I see plants and flowers sprouting in front of my house and I think we are at least a month ahead of schedule from a weather per-spective. It sure feels like an early spring with the sun shining and temps approaching 50 degrees forecast for



remainder of the week. Unfortunately, the fish and our fishing regulations have their own schedule. For those with cabin fever the problem is it's only the end of February and fishing options remain extremely limited.

The west end remains virtually shut down. It seems nobody's sailing at all and when someone does get out the reports are lacking. It's simply a dead sea right now. I actually snuck out with my trusty pail of skimmers in hand and to hit three local wrecks. Results were discouraging to say the least. I may have lost a piece of bait but I think it actually fell off the hook. Not a sign of life or bait despite reasonable water temps in the low forties. Montauk remains fairly quiet, cod fishing seems picky at best. One knowledge-able skipper from Moriches has put together some decent catches of cod. He has run far and wide to do it while hitting a variety of lightly fished bottom.

The warming weather and water will get fish moving and so it will begin, just need to exercise patience. An early spring does allow for an early start on boat preparation washing, waxing, bottom painting, dock fees and all the great things that go along with boating.

Meanwhile, we await word from the NYDEC regarding a spring blackfish season. Talk is of an April season, maybe two fish per angler, greater than 16". While it may cut into the fall season a bit, it would make combination trips of blackfish / flounder or blackfish / bass and even blackfish / cod feasible and give a boost to the head boat and bait and tackle industry. We need something else to fish for, winter flounders are just not cutting it these days

STRIPER DIARIES

As March quickly approaches, I can't help but dream about my annual fishing trip on the Hudson River with Pete Cefai, in search of the "gray ghost." Chasing striped bass and following the migration has been a family adventure for as long as I can remember. For those of you whose boats are still on blocks, mine included, fishing off a river bank is another great option.

In a little town called Piermont, just south of the Tappan Zee Bridge, striped bass season opens April 1, 2018 and closes November 30, 2018. The legal limit is one (1) fish a person between 18 - 28 inches, with a trophy bass over 40 inches, and the choice of bait is blood worms or live herring. Accessing the fishing grounds is relatively simple. A one-day parking permit for nonresidents is available. This will allow you to drive onto the pier, which stretches about one (1) mile into the Hudson River.

When fishing a new location from shore, especially the murky waters of the Hudson, I always like to arrive on the outgoing tide. It is crucial to view the water level at its lowest point. The river has a 4-6 foot tide swing, and on high tide any rocks, pilings and sand bars will be virtually invisible. This means that until you are familiar with an area, you will have to fish two tides - yes you will be late for dinner.

As we set up our light spinning gear, a two foot leader with slider rig works best. This way the bass cannot feel the weight of the sinker when they grab the bait. As is customary on this river bank, we put bells on the tip of our rods - when in Rome. In my experience, most bass bite at night. As we didn't bring sleeping bags,

we decide to fish until we can no longer keep our eyes open. After a few hours we were greeted with the sound of our bells. Tap, tap, tap, and just like that we landed two (2) keeper bass. Nothing big, but keepers for sure.



As the night came to an end and we started the drive home, I couldn't help but feel sheer excitement. It wasn't because the bass were thirty or forty pounders, but because we conquered a new territory and had a great time doing it. There is nothing better than fresh air, sun shining on your face, and knowing that you landed not one (1) but two (2) of the elusive gray ghosts.

As we continue to follow the striped bass migration, our next stop will be Little Neck Bay on April 15 - - Opening Day . Until our next adventure. Tight lines.


