# Captain Harry Weinblatt F/V Blue Marlin

The month of March came in like a lion and left like one as well. The start of this month was no different than any other early spring month, lots of east wind and plenty of rain to go along with it. March did have its nice days, which allowed some members to get their boats in the water. As the month of April wears on, the weather should begin to moderate for a long enough period to allow the rest of us to get our boats ready for another season. Our local waters are still on the cool side with water temps still in the low forty degree range. Warm sunny days with winds from a more southerly direction will help to jump start our season. I can only hope that by the end of April our springtime fishery will be in full swing as well as the reports for this column that go along with them.

On the local fishing front our flounder season has started with lackluster results, most recently Capt. Jim Krug skippered his Persuader and made several local drops in Baldwin Bay and reported four fat flounder for his maiden trip of the 2008 season.

Our resident bottom fisherman are just starting to get their boats

in the water for the season. One boat that was ready for a window of weather was Bob Hindenlang's Tin Man. He took advantage of a sudden change in the weather forecast and poked his bow out of the inlet for some local action. He and his crew worked hard and put together a small catch of Blackfish along with a sprinkling of Cod.

The local cod action off of Montauk has slowed up and there are reports that the fishing up North is stating to pick up. If that is the case then it is just in time as our Annual Off Shore Cod fish Trip will be departing Montauk this Friday April 11th at 7:00PM. This trip is currently sold out.

Lastly the word on Mackerel is not yet. As the month of April comes to a close we can only hope that the vast schools of this species will make an appearance this year. Last year the fish transited very far south of Long Island and showed up at Cape Cod. These fish have traditionally been caught in our local waters around the Full Moon period which this year is April 20th. Lets keep our fingers crossed that we can expect a run this year and not a fly by which has been the case the last several years.

#### Weather or Knot to Go?

As the fishing season is fast approaching many of us are already looking at the offshore temp charts. Believe it or not there is 70 degree water not too far off the Hudson and Lindenkohl Canyons. Unfortunately not many boats are in the water capable of heading there at this time of year. Fortunately we have weather services from NOAA that will assist in our decision-making as to "weather" we head off or "knot". How many times and years have we complained about the lousy and inaccurate forecasts? How many times have we headed home in 4-6 foot seas when we expected 2-3s? NOAA has just re-zoned the weather forecasting area from the Hudson to Baltimore Canyons narrowing down their forecasts to a more manageable area with improved wind knot speed, wave height and overall conditions. Well, this is not going to make the forecast bulletproof but the newer Zone will hopefully make it a bit better and more on target. Now all we need is for Congress to allocate more money to the national National Data Buoy Center so they can deploy a real time weather buoy at the Hudson Canyon to really provide the accurate forecasts we need.

#### New Offshore Zone to be Launched June 2

On Monday June 2 2008 At 1200 Universal Coordinated Time /Utc/ Or 0800 Eastern Daylight Time /Edt/...The Nws Ocean Prediction Center /Opc/ Will Split Its Offshore Marine Zone In The North Atlantic Ocean...Hudson Canyon To Baltimore Canyon...Into Two New Offshore Marine Zones To Provide Greater Specificity In The Offshore Marine Zone Forecasts For The North Atlantic. The First New Zone Will Be Named Hudson To Baltimore Canyon. The Second New Zone Will Be Named Baltimore Canyon To The Hague Line South Of 1000 Fathoms.

The Demarcation Line For The New Zones Extends From 39.3 North 71.9 West...Southwestward To 37.7 North 72.9 West.




