FISHING BULLETIN



Captain Harry Weinblatt F/V Blue Marlin S I had predicted last month March came in like a lion and left like

a lamb, well maybe as close to a lamb as one could think.. The start of this month should be no different than any other early spring month, lots of wind and plenty of rain to go along with it. Although March did have its nice days, which allowed some members to start the process of getting their boats ready for the upcoming season. Lets hope that as the month of April wears on, the weather should begin to moderate to allow the rest of us to get our boats ready for another season. Our local waters are still on the cool side with water temps still in the low forty degree range. Warm sunny days with winds from a more southerly direction will help to jump start our season. The end of April should have our springtime fishery in full swing and hopefully reports for this column that go along with them.

On the local fishing front our flounder season is ready to start and April 1st is the opening day for the fishery this year. Baldwin Bay is usually the area that gets the most attention from our local club members. As the reports develop from the extreme western areas such as Raritan Bay, The Cedars and Romer Shoals, I am quite certain that should spark an interest from some of our members to make the thirty mile run to this area to cash in on the spring flounder season.

On the offshore scene I had an opportunity, during a very mild Saturday two weeks ago, to run the Blue Marlin to several wrecks south east of our inlet in search of the mighty golden guppy. After two lackluster stops, three is a charm and our last stop of the day yielded twelve keeper sized cod to 15lbs, a few pollack, seabass to 4lbs and a handful of baseball bat sized ling. That action took place 59 miles from our inlet in 195 feet of water.

The local cod action off of Montauk has slowed up recently after two and one half months of unbelievable action. The fishing up north in the Gulf of Maine is set to open two weeks ahead of schedule on April 1st due to a recent change from NMFS. If that is the case then it is just in time as our Annual Off Shore Cod fish Trip will be departing Montauk Friday April 17th at 7:00PM. We are now scheduled to sail aboard the Viking Starship as the Viking Superstar will be headed up to Boston for daily trips to Stellwagon Bank.

Lastly the word on Mackerel is not yet. As the month of April comes to a close we can only hope that the vast schools of this species will make an appearance this year for what used to be a traditional spring run. Last year the fish showed up briefly south of our inlet for about two days and then showed up at Cape Cod. These fish have traditionally been caught in our local waters around the Full Moon period which this year is May 9th. Lets keep our fingers crossed that we can expect a run this year and not a fly by which has been the case for many of the last several years.

*Owners may use electric including battery charges only when present. No vessel, under any circumstance shall be left plugged in and unattended. *Kindly tightly wrap all shrink wrappings and DO NOT place in our garbage container. Shrink wrap

will be removed by the boat owner. *Yard property under boats must be protected with a tarp prior to any boat painting or scrapping.

*On launch day each member will stack their cement blocks on the wooden pallets in the yard. *As per your contract all winter boats must be off the property by May 1st. Member not incompliance will be bill for additional land storage. Please keep this date in mind as we will be having our yard sale

May16th *Water should be on by the first week of April. Kindly respect the property and make sure all hoses in use have nozzles and are put away after use.

This month the balance of all 2009 summer dockage is due. Kindly submit your payments promptly. Our waiting list is currently available and now is a good time to get on our list. We have beam width slips ranging from $10' \sim 14'$ and we can comfortably accommodate vessels up to 36'

Inshore: This is no Fluke!!

DEC NY Fluke Regulation's Finalized for 2009 New York State Department of Environmental Conservation announced new limits for summer flounder (fluke) for the upcoming recreational fishing season.

For 2009, the minimum size limit will be 21 inches, compared to 20.5 last year. The bag limit will be two fish, down from four. Additionally, there will be a split season:

Open: May 15 – June 15. Closed: June 16 – July 2. Open: July 3 – August 17. Closed thereafter.

Note: New York is prepared to quickly make adjustments to the fluke season and bag limits in the event that the court renders a favorable decision this season, so let's keep our fingers crossed.
