Fishing Report

As of this writing we will already in preparation for our 2013 season... so it will not be long before we are in full swing. Cool weather has not been helpful in getting our boats ready but hopefully this coming month we will get the weather we need to launch our boats and complete our property projects.

No word yet on our spring mackerel run, however it history proves correct they should make their appearance in very late April.

Reports are still are finally coming from our members. So here is the latest:

On the offshore tuna scene, Captain Steve Rodeos reports this slammer trip:

Captain Stephen Rhodes and the crew from the F/V "Legacy" made the trip to Oregon Inlet and fished with Capt. Mark DeBlasio on the 60 F/V "Canyon Runner" on St. Patty's Day. They started the day fast with a 72 inch 200+ pound bluefin hitting the decks in half an hour. Ten minutes later they had another one hooked up and brought to the boat in 40 minutes that was released and in the 350 pound class. The seas started at 4.6 feet and b



class. The seas started at 4-6 feet and built throughout the day to around 8-10 feet when a triple-header of 400-450 bluefins hit at 1:30. Captain



Stephen landed the first one in about 15 minutes on a 50-Wide and then went on to finish off the other two in fights that lasted one hour and thirty minutes in total. All three bluefins were released and the crew went a stellar 5 for 5 in rough conditions. Day 2 was blown out with 35 knot east winds but the tired and happy crew headed north with coolers full of Toro. The season has been kicked off for the FTC and we

can't wait to see these fish migrating by the Texas Towers in mid-May. We'll be there to greet them.

Barbara Solomon reports the 1st Strip bass of our season. Barbara fished the Hudson River just south of the Tapanzee Bridge on Sunday Marc 24th. Here is Barbara's 1st striper trip of the season blow-blow:

"We decided to take a road trip Sunday morning up the Hudson River in search of stripers. The season opens March 16, north of the George Washington Bridge. Loaded the car with rods, bait and hit the road. Traveled about 60 miles to a spot that looked promising. Temps were a little chillier than we anticipated. Geared up at the car, and hiked our way in through the woods to the "spot". Came out onto a clearing with a swift N Wind. Blood worms were on the menu. Fished all of outgoing tide with 2 run offs. This whole Hudson River fishing thing was very different than what we were used to. After the tide ran out, we decided to stay and wait for incoming. I mean after all we had already committed to the mile walk in, so turning back wasn't really an option.

As the tide came in and the sun set, we set up our rods. Tap Tap.. is that a fish.. Yup sure was!! A keeper striper .. As the night fall set in, we missed several other fish, landing 3 in total. I had 2 and Pete 1.

Packed up after dark and trekked back to the truck. Met a couple of nice local guys along the way who were even willing to give us some worms, after we ran out. Was a great trip and we are planning to follow the striper migration up the Hudson River all month."

Out eastern Captain, Charlie Sporing reported many efforts to sail with all trips being a blow-out. The effort is there but Mother Nature was not ready. With such winds and a family Easter vacation trip planned. Captain Charlie spent the week in Maryland. Charlie stole a day and fished the rail on Captain Monty Hawkin's F/V "Morning Star". Charlie bested 3 fine keeper "Tog" weighing in a 14 lbs. 3 oz. & two others in the 10 lb. class. The Tog will make Charlie a strong fish to beat for our Annual Global Award. On the boating front with so many vessels being damage we welcome the following new boats into our club: Captain Bruce Forester is the new owner of a beautiful 35' Carolina Classic. The vessel sports twin 480 Cummins & full tower. She is combat ready, both the Captain and his new offshore rig welcome members of the FTC to crew her this coming season. The all new "O'Reely" with be birthed in Bayshore Long Island. Best of luck Captain Bruce.

Captain Billy Mannio reports the all new arrival of his new 27' Judge. After selling his 35 Duffy, Captain Billy is back in the game! The all New F/V "White Knight" sports a 300 Suzuki outboard & twin anchors.

Annual Offshore Cod Trip May 3 - 5, 2013

This is the fourteenth year that the Freeport Tuna Club will be running its spring time fishing extravaganza. We will be sailing aboard the Viking Starship departing from Montauk once again. In past years we have traditionally fished off the coast of Massachusetts at the Stellwagon National Marine Sanctuary for Cod, Pollack, Haddock, Wolfish and other mixed species. Impending regulations could derail fishing in that area. We are planning on heading offshore south of Montauk to some of Capt. Steven Foresberg's secret wrecks which he is saving for our trip. We will be targeting Cod, Hake, Pollack and other species on day one. On day two we will hit some offshore wrecks off the coast of Nantucket. If the weather is not conducive for the offshore trip and the impending regulations are not enacted upon then we will head back up to Stellwagon Bank and enjoy the traditional fishery which has not disappointed us in the past. The boat will be leaving Montauk Friday evening May 3rd at approx 7:00PM and returning back to Montauk Sunday evening May 5th at approx 10:00PM. The fare for this year's trip is \$ 320.00 and will be strictly limited to 35 anglers. I will be collecting payment in full at the upcoming General Meeting which is scheduled for March 14th 2013.

If you are interested or on the fence about going on this trip, please take note that there are a limited number of spots available so sign up now and you will not miss the boat. This is one of the best events that the club runs and if you are into club camaraderie then look no further as you will enjoy plenty of that on this trip.

Catch of the Month Big Maryland Tog

Our catch of the month goes to Charlie Sporing who caught this fine 14.3 lb. Tautog (aka blackfish) while fishing on the Morning Star out of Ocean City Maryland recently. Charlie had great things to say about Capt Monty Hawkins and crew. Capt. Monty is a huge proponent of reef building and common sense fisheries management and certainly knows where the big ones live.



Our current FTC record stands at 16.88

lbs. caught by Denis Cataldo, also in Ocean City Maryland. The IGFA record stands at 25 lbs even, caught in Ocean City New Jersey.

Warmer water tog' are known to grow to larger proportions than those in northern N.J. and up through New England. Some feel this is due to a lack of shutdown or hibernation period when compared to the coolers waters in northern areas, similar to many freshwater species.

Unfortunately, N.Y. longer offers a spring season. Current N.Y. regulations allow 4 fish per angler, greater than 16" in length, from October 5th to December 14th.
