The fishing regulations of immediate interest are: Striped Bass: opens April 15th. We are allowed 1 fish at 28" and 1 fish over 40" until December 15th.

Flounder: opens April 1st and closes May 30th. Allowed 2 fish at 12"

Fluke: We have gone regional so we have 5 fish at 18" from May 17th through September 21st.

Sea Bass: July 10th through December 31st. Allowed 8 fish at 13".

Porgies: May 1st through December 31st. Allowed 30 fish at 10".

Weakfish: opened all year with 1 fish at 16".

Codfish: opened all year with 10 fish at 22"

## Fishing Report - Spring Kickoff

I have been asked to help fill one of the many voids left by the untimely passing of Capt Larry Festa. Big shoes to fill, but with the help of the FTC membership, the FTC Fishing Report continue on. Rest in piece Capt. Larry, you will be missed ...

Winter in review - As we are all well aware we experienced a harsh winter that came early and has been reluctant to leave. Late fall blackfishing shut down early as water temps plummeted. With the large schools of sandeels and fine fall bass jigging we experienced along the beach came hopes of a great winter cod run locally. If the cod were here, nobody knew it. Very few trips left the dock due to the unrelenting winds and cold, those who went generally reported hyper cold water temps down to a chilly 33 degrees, and a complete "shutdown" of life on the pieces inshore and off.

Right now, cod fishing remains spotty with some fish reported in the deepest mudhole wrecks and other wrecks well to the east, the exclusive domain of the Moriches / Shinnecock fleets and the 60/70 mile trips by west end party boats. Very few reports from Montauk this past month as the fleet was hampered by a combination of bad weather and lackluster fishing. Currently, water temps are around 40 degrees in the NY Bight which is still quite cold. The water will warm up, seabass and blackfish will move inshore but unfortunately, current NY State recreational regulations allow for no spring blackfish season and a seabass opening of July 10th.

Flounder season opened April 1st and runs through May 30th , 2 fish at greater than 12".

In scanning the reports I have not heard of a single fish caught. Locally, I did hear a rumor of 2 fish caught, but that was several weeks ago during a stretch of warm weather (two days in a row). Best shot for flounder right now would require the long run to Raritan or Jamaica Bay. As the water warms some fish will show, shouldn't be long.

Striped bass season opens on April 15th runs through December 15th, 2 fish per angler at greater than 28".

The FTC Spring Cod Derby is on ! (March 15th and runs through May 4th )

The Spring Flounder Derby opens April 5th and runs through May 18th.
