FISHING REPORT

LET THE SEASON BEGIN

Spring showed up, briefly, but it seems winter has returned. Not unusual for



April which is notoriously windy and rainy. Spring will reappear and when it does things will be in full swing. Still very few first hand reports but they are beginning to trickle in. In mid March I joined Nick Nero on his "Dolce Vita" along with Pete Cefai and Captain John Jutt. We started S/E and ended up S/W of the inlet, hitting a large variety of wrecks from 65' to 150' of water. The results were the same nearly everywhere, a small cod here, a small cod there, but no real population of fish in any particular spot or area. At least we got out and bent the rods a bit on a beautiful calm day. We also had a couple of blackfish (released) and a ling or two, along with the usual dogs, pout, etc. Thanks Nick!

I know of some who tried flounder locally with zero results. Captain Jim Krug went bass fishing with some buddies on the western LI Sound and had some school bass (released) on lead heads. Flounder have made an appearance in Raritan and Jamaica Bays for anyone willing to take a long ride. Bass will open on April 15th, fish have appeared in numerous spots, but especially Raritan and Jamaica Bays so combo trips (flounder/bass) are a possibility. Bunker have already made appearances in all the bays so the mother lode of bass and blues will not be far behind.

We asked for reports from vacationing anglers and our FTC members stepped up big time with some impresses catches. Starting with a nice report from Harry Pour, in his own words "Just came back from the keys, and had a productive fishing trip in Islamorada with my lovely wife aboard captain Joey Spaulding's "LegaSea." The day started with 4 kingfish in 20-30 lbs class. Then we had a triple hook up on sailfish. which we ended up with landing 2 of them. 20

minutes later had another sail hook up on site fishing. 15 minutes later was landed and released. After lunch we hit the reef, which produced 2 dozen yellowtail snappers, half a dozen mangrove

snapper and a nice grouper. All released to be caught again, except one mangrove snapper that ended up as my dinner that night". Thanks for a great report Harry!

I spoke with Captain Mike Zullo who told me about his fishing adventures while vacationing in Islamorada. He fished a charter with the "Captain Easy" where they enjoyed fast action catching "three and four red snapper at a time" (released), some kingfish, and a good catch of vermillion and lane snapper. Fishing with club member Mike Wager on his "Islamorada Girl," and joined by Don Granger, they had vellowtail and some grouper. Capt. Mike commented on the amount of wind down there (sounds familiar) and a vellowtail season that was

"off." Capt. Mike also mentioned that the Jersey head boat, the "Golden Eagle" has reported mackerel and mixed herring the past two weeks. Something to keep an eye on if those fish head our way.

Last but not least was a very impressive report, this time from Key West from Capt. Jim Krug who fished with Capt. Chip Veach. Jim sent me a stream of pictures that included red snapper, jack crevalle, amberjack, spanish mackerel, kingfish, barracuda, and blackfin tuna all caught in one very productive dav fishing. I left out the one he's most proud of, an

8.5 lb porgy for which a weigh slip was obtained for submission as a club record. I asked him if the porgy ripped his arms off, he replied "no, but I'm going to need new elbows."

Water is on.

As members begin to prep their boats for launch just a few reminders.

- **A**. Do not put shrink wrap in the dumpster, there is a recycle spot in the town marina around the corner.
- **B.** Be courteous to the boats next to you when you are washing, waxing or painting.
- **C**. If you plan to strip the bottom or when you paint the bottom be sure to lay a tarp on the ground to keep us in good standing with the DEC.
- **D.** Battery chargers are not to be left on unattended or overnight.
- E. Once boats go into the water only approved marine electrical cords are to be used.
- F. ONCE YOU LAUNCH, IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO STACK-UP THE CINDERBLOCKS ON ONE OF THE PALLETS AROUND THE YARD, AS WELL AS PUT AWAY ANY WOOD USED IN BLOCKING YOUR BOAT
- G. In order to attain a full marina there may be slip assignment changes to some boats. All efforts will be made to keep disruptions to a minimum. I would hope that all marina residents realize the critical nature that wehave a full marina.


