
April 1st marks the opening of a month-long spring blackfish season along with winter flounder and striped bass on our favorite day of the year April 15th. You can see all the recreational seasons and limits on the NYS DEC website, www.dec.ny.gov/outdoor/7894.html. A good site to keep handy so that you always have up to date information as seasons and regulations change frequently.



With the weather warming the activity at the club will start to pick up, when working on your boat please keep in mind the following. No shrink wrap in the dumpster, a tarp must be put down when applying bottom paint and please take any trash with you. Once we get some boats out and in the water, we will be doing our yearly spring clean up of the property. Please stay tuned as we will be recruiting help to get this done.

LET THE SEASON BEGIN

Not much changed on the saltwater fishing front as we head into April. The ocean has warmed up a couple of degrees and with a little nice weather some fishing opportunities will present themselves. For most, April means getting the boat in shape for the new season. I actually got off the dock and fished for a couple of hours one nice Sunday afternoon. I started on the reef and found no life whatsoever. When I encounter this situation, I generally head a little deeper until some life is found. A quick move to Cholera had me drifting and dreaming. I didn't really expect anything but was enjoying a calm sunny day, all alone on the ocean drifting around High Rock. I was startled by a hit, and a bucking rod sharpened up my senses. Sure felt like a cod and a few minutes later I released the keeper cod, not wanting to mess up the boat. The next drift produced another, but that was all for that spot. I did some quick drops at Middle Grounds and Angler Banks and never had

a touch. It was good to get out anyway. Some cod remain available in the deep, particularly on wrecks well to the east. The Montauk fleet remains quiet, I don't remember a year with no boats sailing (to my knowledge) in February or March.

The winter flounder season opens today (April 1st). I checked out the web sites and Facebook pages of a few of the party boats in areas where some flounder are likely to be caught (Jamaica Bay) but couldn't find a single mention of anyone targeting flounder. Very sad. One exception is western North Shore (City Island area) that has continued to produce flounder the past few years. I have a friend who is knowledgeable in this fishery and hope to hitch a ride and catch a flounder or two this spring. The season remains open through May 30, 2 fish per angler greater than 12". Spring blackfish season is now open as well, throughout the month of April. Two fish per angler greater than 16".

Striped bass (marine waters) will open April 15th. As I mentioned last month, the best way to catch very early stripers is to go flounder fishing! The early bass like grubbing the bottom until the water (and their body temperature) warms up a bit. Bunker have been spotted in some of the bays already.

I have been privileged to contribute to the Tuna Tower News for over 10 years, starting off with the Catch of the Month and writing the fishing reports since the untimely passing of Captain Larry Festa. I am hanging up my keyboard, but will remain on Captain John's Bulletin Committee. I thank you all for sharing your tales and pictures and I hope to continue to share some of mine with you.

See you on the water and hopefully at an event or two. Have a safe and successful 2019

In **JUNE**, News 12 Weather Guru Bill Korbel will talk about weather patterns, how they affect fish and what Mariners should watch out for with our weather.



STRIPER DIARIES | EPISODE 12

With opening day of Striped Bass right around the corner, most people are scurrying to cut the shrink wrap off their boats, and begin the spring season. Before my boat is ready, I typically have a couple of trips where I hit the open road and grab my 10ft Ron Arra surf casting rod. Last Sunday, I

did just that. Although the season wasn't officially "open", I decided to take a ride out to Breezy Point. There are many four wheel beach permits that are available to purchase offered by New York State Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation. The first is the Four Wheel Beach Vehicle Fishing Permit which costs \$80.00 for NYS residents and \$125.00 for non-residents. A valid motor

vehicle registration is required, a

driver's license and proof of enrollment (free) in NYS DEC Recreational Marine Fishing Registry. This permit al-



lows 4-wheel drive access for fishing at the fol-

lowing parks: Hither Hills, Montauk Point, and Napeaque year round, 24hr access. You can also fish Robert Moses, but there are certain restrictions. For Democrat Point you must enter before 7:00a.m. or after 5:00p.m. during the summer months from Saturday of Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. All other times is 24 hour access. For Sore Thumb you can enter from April 1 - December 31 with 24 hour access. A quick stop at Robert Moses and with my necessary paperwork and Bam I have my permit and I am ready! This permit includes all of the privileges of the Night Sport Fishing Permit listed below.

For those who simply want to fish the "night bite" there is a Night Sport Fishing Permit. It is \$35.00 for residents and \$60.00 for non-residents. Again, you will need a valid motor vehicle registration, driver's license and proof of enrollment in the NYS DEC Recreational Marine Fishing Registry. This permit allows after sunset parking for fishing only. This does not give you 4-wheel drive access. There are also many rules that apply to this permit. Okay, here is the simplest way I can describe them. Fisherman can access Captree at the Main field, Overlook Field and Captree Drawbridge (north side only). Hither Hills, except Friday of Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. Jones Beach: Fields 6, 10, West End 2, West End Boat Basin, West End Work Docks (24 hr access) and Green Island (24 hr access). You can also fish Montauk Point: lower parking lot only. Robert Moses: Field 2; Field 3 from September 15 through December 31-24 hour access and Field 4 from April 1 through June 23 from 7p.m to 7a.m. and September 15- December 31, 24 hr access. This permit also give access to Sunken Meadow: Field 1, Field 3 - 24 hr access and the Main Field. Lastly, if you are not entirely confused and can remember all these rules, you can fish Wildwood in the Main Field.

For those Montauk enthusiasts, there is a Camp Hero Fishing Permit. You will need the standard registration, license and enrollment in the DEC registry. This permit allows access to following areas for fishing only. Camp Hero: upper bluff parking area after sunset parking only. Lower bluff parking lot, 24 hr access. The permit is valid from April 1 through December 31 and is sold at the Montauk Downs Park office and the State Park Headquarters in West Babylon.






