#### FISHING BULLETIN

am sure we will all agree that as April draws to a close, we are all either in the mode of getting ready for the upcoming season or have taken advantage of it already. Some of us are further ahead of others but by the close of this month, all of us should be on the same level playing field. Our property is buzzing with activities as club members hurry to get their boats off land and back into the

environment they belong in. As the month of May wears on we can expect to see a continued strengthening in all of our springtime fisheries and a continued moderation in our weather. Since we were not burdened with a cold winter it has not taken long for the areas water temps to come alive as the sun continues to shine. We have also heard that a large core eddy of Gulf Stream water has broken off and is spinning inshore. The far eastern canyons have had a taste of tuna action already and with that said baring any major changes in our offshore waters our offshore season could be thirty days ahead of last year. Wouldn't that be nice for a change?

On the local fishing front several of our club boats have made the trek to the west in search of the spring flounder and have reported very good catches. The Tin Man, Magic Too, The Four Bells and Mickey Likes It, have taken limit catches of fish up to 2 lbs.

Captain Larry Festa skippered the Kristen to the west in search of the mighty blackfish. He and his crew of Bob Hindenlang and Joe Fanora reported phenomenal fishing with the largest fish reported at 7lbs.

After an information packed striped bass seminar at the clubhouse last week, Chris Bellinzoni, skippered his Four Bells to catch the magical part of the tide that evening.

Accompanied by crew of Al Casiano and new club member Jeff Yapalater, they boated a few fish just to show Jeff how local bass fishing is done the FTC way. The action did not stop there. This past weekend Chris invited more club members to share in on the same action and reported even stronger fishing with the largest at 12lbs. Also on Sunday Dave Masa and crew cashed in on the same bass action. He and his crew reported bending the rod quite a few times. Its obvious that Dave took excellent notes and was able to translate that into a

good catch for his crew.

The report from out east is that the cod fishing might have slowed up a little but the black fishing was "on fire" according to Capt Jim Krug. He and his crew ran the Persuader to a spot off of Block Island in very rough conditions. Jim reported that from the very moment that the crabs hit the bottom the blackfish were growling at them. They limited out in short order, with the pool fish of 9.0lbs going to Capt. John Jutt. With plenty of time left in the day they proceeded to another drop and caught cod to 12.0lbs and snowshoe flounders up to 3.0lbs.

The word on the mackerel is not this year, there gone. The report last week was that several boats had some shots of fish southeast of Fire Island and the reports were very scattered at best. Since the Bass and Bluefish have already made a presence on our local waters, the Mackerel decided not to stick around.

Our Annual Offshore Codfish Trip was great for friendship and camaraderie but not for catching this year. We departed Montauk, our first destination 150 miles to the southern part of the Gulf of Maine. Six wrecks later and only a dozen fish it was time to move on. We proceeded north to Georges Bank and made several stops along the way. By the afternoon with lackluster results onboard and a deteriorating window of weather we decided to head back inshore to spend the night and salvage any remaining part of the trip. On Sunday morning we awoke to a fresh east wind blowing at 25 knots. We all manned our rail spots. Jay Broder took the first place, cod only pool, with a 20lb. fish that netted him \$615.00 and Sean Libby captured the other pool with a Pollack of 10lbs. That fish netted him \$ 410.00. We fished until it became apparent that this years trip was not like the ones in the past and we all decided that it was time to head for home. Thank you to all club members who participated in this annual event.

The Fluke Regs were finally released as I previously stated. They are 4 fish at 18" with the season opening on May 6th and closing on Sept. 12th. The Porgies become legal on June 1st with a 25 fish limit at 10 1/2 inches. They close on October 31st. Remember the Blackfish season closes on May 31st and reopens on October 1st.
