FISHING BULLETIN

pril showers bring May flowers and even though it has not stopped

raining yet, that has not kept our FTC members from getting out and going fishing. The month of May has started out with a loud bang. Our springtime inshore species have transitioned into our local area waters recently and it has been "fish on" for every one who has been out to wet a line. The very mild weather with very warm sunny skies which we experienced during the later part of April has had a two fold effect, firstly it has helped to jump start our spring fishery and secondly afforded the boat owners a window of weather to make ready their vessels for another season. Our property has been alive with action as members vessels have started to occupy their in water berths on an almost daily basis. As the month of May wears on we can expect that our weather will continue to moderate and hopefully cooperate enough to allow the rest of our membership to cash in on our traditional springtime fishery.

On the local fishing front striped bass is on the menu. Recently Chris Bellinzoni single handedly skippered his inshore vessel "Kismet Joe" to a few back bay spots on a recent incoming tide and was happy to report that the bass were cooperative. He boated 10 bass, 8 being keeper sized the largest a 34 inch 14lb. specimen. All fish were tagged and released. Joe Mangiapanello was able to draw first blood on his new vessel "Crazy G" accompanied by an FTC crew of Brian Dougherty and Tim Sherman, the trio was able to entice 4 bass and several bluefish into their slick with one of the bass making its way home for the dinner table. Congratulations on your first outing and remember to always keep the "larger net" ready for action. Nick Nero accompanied by the father and son team of the Cefai's sailed his "Dolce Vida" to a spot in our inlet over the weekend. They reported non-stop action with bluefish, leaving them biting at the end of the tide.

Our blackfish season is now closed and our members who are passionate about them fished right up to the last day. Mike "now retired" Zullo sailed several days last week and reported decent fishing on most of his local drops. Bob "Tin Man" Hindenlang landed on the mother load one day last week with a 9lber and 12lber on almost simultaneously. The 12lber was caught by Joe Fanora, his personal best. Jim Krug also skippered his "Persuader" several times last week and reported a mix of blackfish and seabass. Paul Hilton recently skippered his "Emily S" to a few spots in 15-20 fathoms of water and reported a popurri of smallish cod, seabass and blackfish. A stop inshore yielded a few more tog for the ride home in his fish box.

Our Fluke season is set to open on May 15th and with the arrival of squid to our area, the fishery should open with a vengeance. Our much awaited mackerel run was another disappointment for those who were anticipating a springtime run. Our fishery has changed over the years and it should be apparent that the season to target them has changed to the late fall and early winter. During the springtime these fish have too much pressure on them as both bass and bluefish are literally on their hind tails migrating north. These fish are swimming frantically north to the cooler waters off New England in an effort to keep from being forage. During the late fall and early winter the pressure is off of them as the bass and bluefish have already migrated through our area heading south. The mackerel season although it might last two weeks is usually a very good fishery with long drifts

and all you want action being the norm.

On the offshore scene it is still to early and its looks like we will not have a "cinco de tuna" this year. There is some nice water way, way off to the east in Munson Canyon. Hopefully this will one of many eddies that move through our canyons this season and provide us with an offshore season. Congratulations to Capt.Chris Gerhart on the recent purchase of his new offshore sled. He and his crew will be transiting offshore in a 35 Henriques with twin Cummins this season. Best of luck on your new ride.

CONSERVATION

The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission, which controls the regulations for state waters, held a public hearing April 23rd to discuss a proposed moratorium on the taking of winter flounder. As is usually the case at these meetings, the bulk of the attendees represented commercial interests. These folks supported the moratorium, probably because commercial winter flounder fishing in federal waters has already been halted as of May 1st., and if they can't take flounder they don't want anyone else getting any. No decision has been reached, but it seems likely that there will be no winter flounder fishing next year.

From the Here's Another Reason You Can't Trust the Government Department comes this: everyone knows that the Governor's new budget creates a saltwater fishing license for the first time in New York State. We were told that all the monies collected by the license fees would be deposited in a dedicated Marine Resources Account to be used for fisheries management. Well, the ink was hardly dry on the budget when the Governor ordered that the cost of salary and benefits for the Dept. of Environmental Conservation, formerly paid for from general funds, be transferred to the Marine Resources Account. Now, not only will the license fees not be used for the benefit of the angler, but the license fee will probably have to be raised in the first year to cover the cost of this transfer! Blackfish closed April 30th. Porgies remain closed until June 12th. Flounder will close after May 30th.

Fluke will open May 15th until June 15th and close June 16th until it reopens July 3rd and closes after August 17th. Anglers will be allowed 2 fish daily at 21 inches minimum Sea bass 12 inches – 25 fish remain open. Weakfish 16 inches – 6 fish are open. Cod remain open with 22-inch minimum. Striped Bass remain open.

The Saltwater license will become a reality on October 1st for \$10 a year.=2 0The license runs 1/1/2010 to 12/31/2010. I believe there will be blanket coverage for the fishing on head boats and charters. Those for-hire vessels will be required to pay \$400 a year for its' "umbrella license". I believe this license is for ages 16 years and older. Any questions, call Dennis Cataldo, Conservation Chairman.
