Fishing Report The 2015 Season is Underway



April started where March left off, cold, nasty and with virtually no fishing opportunities. Everything has now changed.

Early in the month cod fishing was just about the only game in town. Boats from NJ north and east to Shinnecock took advantage of the



surprising numbers of large cod inhabiting the wrecks from 140' on out. Equally surprising remains the almost complete lack of cod available to the Montauk fleet.

A group from the Freeport Tuna Club took a ride on the Laura Lee out of Captree. Departing late at night they headed well offshore and enjoyed good cod fishing. Bob Pandy took second place in the pool with a nice 19.7 lb cod.

Flounder fishing, especially locally was virtually non-existent. Some fish are being caught in Raritan Bay out to Roamer but with bluefish making a presence it usually ends quickly.

Captain Barbara Solomon attempted several striped bass hunts with the season opening on April 15th. She fished Jamaica bay and the north shore but struck out. More recently, she took an exploratory trip down to Raritan Bay and reported "all the bluefish you wanted", but still no bass. The fish were caught on swimming plugs. Bass fishing, particularly to the west, has opened up with nice sized fish reported in Raritan Bay,

Flynn's Knoll and Roamer Shoal. Early on, clam chumming was best but the fish are now responding to bunker spoons, stretch plugs and rubber shad on the troll or live / chunk bunker on the hook. Schoolies have been reported in Jones Inlet on clam chum so bass fishing is fully underway.

Blue fishing is phenomenal from NJ east to at least Fire Island Inlet, and probably even further east by the time you read this. Loads of bait and jigging opportunities exist just off the beach, look for the bait, diving gannets, etc. and you can "get the blues".

Tim Sherman reports a blackfish trip to

Cape May NJ "to get their share of huge tog" with club member Pete DiThomas and Chris and Jeff from Cauaseway B&T. "Unfortunately, huge Tog did not show. We did however catch 70 total Tog and got our limit of legal size fish. Pete was high hook and had the largest fish at 6.0 lb. The 70 fish was a grind, the Capt. made at least 8 drops". They fished with Capt. Phil of Duckwork Sportfishing.

Finally, the water is warming and bottom fishing is coming to life. Captain Jim Krug reported that his son Bobby and some friends had good cod fishing on inshore wrecks locally. Seabass and blackfish made an appearance for them as well. Ling fishing is on the upswing too.

A couple of reports from down south before all the snowbirds come north. Mike Wagner fishing his Islamorada Girl took a nice 20 lb. black grouper on 10lb test on his yellow tail rod. The fish was released as black grouper were not in season. Paul Cunningham, Ken Kapner and Gene Schettini took a trip down to Panama, fishing from April 5th to April 12th. The highlights of the trip were Gene with a 130lb. yellow fin, Paul with a large pompano, and Ken with a 50 lb. cuberra snapper and large grouper. Congrat's on a very nice trip guys !

Conservation The Shark Circle Hook Law

The new circle hook law has caused a lot of confusion, mostly due to a lack of information about what the law requires and how much jurisdiction New York State has over the shark fishery. Here's the entire text of the new law, known as Environmental Conservation Law Section 13-0338(5):

"Sharks, excluding spiny dogfish, shall not be taken for commercial or recreational purposes by baited hooking except with the use of nonstainless steel non-offset circle hooks. In addition, no person shall conduct, sponsor or participate in any shark tournament unless said tournament's rules and regulations require the exclusive use of nonstainless steel non-offset circle hooks."

New York's jurisdiction over the marine waters extends only three miles from the beach, so the law cannot be enforced while fishing offshore. However, the state regains jurisdiction once you return to shore, so the law could be enforced against a fisherman landing a shark at any dock in New York. The state also has jurisdiction over events that are based and conducted in New York; that is why they can force the tournaments to require circle hooks. An interesting footnote to the statue provides the law is automatically repealed on December 31, 2016, so unless the legislature amends the law again we will be stuck with these rules this year and next season, and then go back to no circle hook requirement in 2017.

So what can they do to you for the heinous act of using a non-circle hook to catch a shark? Violation of 13-0338(5) is punishable by a fine of up to \$250, or fifteen days in jail.

Shark: June 20, Atlantic Beach.

Striped Bass: July 10, 11 and 12, Atlantic Beach, Martinecock, Staten Island.

Black Fish: October 9, 10 and 11, Atlantic Beach, Martinecock, and Staten Island.
