The regs are the same as last year with a length of 18" and bag limit of 5. Sea bass as of this writing are still on last year's regs. Seems to be some short bass showing up on the bar and in the back bays.

Our property is starting to show signs of life with shrink wrap coming off and bottom paint going on. Five boats are in the water with more to come each week. So far, Mother Nature

has been kind to us with warm days and little rain. Speaking of Mothers... don't forget Mother's day or you may not be going fishing. Our yard sale is shaping up nicely and looks to be another great event. Helping out at these events is a good way to get involved in club activities. Thursday nights have begun, the awning is up and the ice machine is up and running.

Some of you asked why I don't include a picture with the President's message. No one needs to see an old, little, skinny bald guy every month, but I'll make a deal; I'll include a picture as soon as we reach 70 members at a GM. Attendance at the yacht club meeting was only marginally better.

Fishing Report

April Showers Bring May Flowers (Fluke And Bass Too)

Everything's greening up nicely and some of the warmer water species have arrived in our local waters. Flounder reports locally remain nonexistent. If anyone is catching them they are keeping it very quiet. Apparently, the boats east of JI area have enjoyed a decent run, described as "best in years", with most reports coming from the West Channel. Many limits were reported, two fish per angler is not great, but it's nice to get out on the water and bend a rod. A return of winter flounder to Long Island would be welcomed with open arms by anglers and anyone making a living in the boating / fishing industry.

Jamaica bay and Raritan Bay have been quiet on the flounder front too, but maybe the numerous bass and blues chased them away. Striped bass fishing remains red hot to the west, primarily in Raritan Bay, bass up to 40 plus in the reports, with mixed sized bluefish too. Live lining, chunking, and trolling have all been effective, jigs have been coming into play as well. Larger fish have been trolled and live lined south of East Rockaway Inlet and I'm sure these fish are right off JI and heading east as you read this.

Schoolie bass have been in the JI area for some time as evidenced by an April 18th report from Chris Bellinzoni who said, "They're here!! My log books show this is my first April Four Bell's Bass since 2006. We always tag & release our first trip keepers. 53 degree water. Had to fight through 50 dog fish! But we are on the board." Nice job Chris and crew. I say, "may the dogs leave us alone, and the bass do the hounding!"

Fluke fishing is underway in the local bays. I took a boat ride recently from my dock in Woodcleft Canal, turned right at Ritchie's, and headed back toward Randall Bay. Sure enough, some of the local pin hookers were at work. I didn't intend to fish, but had tackle and gulp onboard, so quickly rigged up. Two quick drifts, a dropped fish and one landed and released confirmed my suspicions, the Fluke are here. I did another quick trip with my son Paul and John Jutt onboard expecting good catch and release action. It wasn't so easy that day, but we had 4 or 5 and a bunch of sea robins. At least we enjoyed some sunshine and camaraderie. Jim Krug reported on a similar trip. All the usual early season spots are holding fish, Merrick Bay, outside Randall, etc. Season will be as follows:

Fluke Season: Open May 17 - Sept 21, Length: 18", Creel limit: 5

On the bottom scene, the Captain Al has reported that their ling fishing is picking up and a few cod remain in the mix. The inshore reefs are holding good numbers of small blackfish and some cod. In early April, I did a short exploratory trip and found the blackfish cooperative on some local drops enjoying fast catch and release action. Had some small cod too. Had to move around a bit, some drops had no life whatsoever. All fish were safely released, blackfish are quite hardy. Some seabass have already been reported as well. Mike and Maryellen Zullo (MEP) went further off and found some

keeper cod and a Pollack.


In summary, things are looking up. Striped bass and blue fishing is underway, and will only get better as the fish move east. Fluke will open May 17th, that fishing will improve as the water warms up and larger fish migrate into this area. The offshore season is just around the corner. Warm blue water was just south of the New Jersey Canyons.

We await the final word on the 2016 seabass season, but expect it to open mid July or so.

Chris has been fishing the tidal waters of Long Island's South Shore since the mid 70s. His true passion is the pursuit of the elusive Mako Shark. Chris and his crew can be found on the 20-30 fathom curve during the shark migration period with a seaworthy downeast platform beneath him and his crew.

Chris has had numerous impressive landings of Mako Shark up to 300 lb. and Thresher Shark nearly tipping the scales at 500 lb.

Chris wishes to dedicate his time and effort with this clinic to the club and in memory of Captain Lawrence J. Fester, F/V Kristen. Chris and his crew captured the First Annual Lawrence J. Fester Memorial Trophy with an impressive Mako.

A very visible and well identified down east offshore platform plying the offshore waters south of Long Island for three decades.

He has embraced a new passion for small craft offshore fishing. As a result has scaled down his tackle and employs many of the newer tactics in shark fishing which are an integral part of his endless pursuit of the pelagic species that he now shares with his son James.


