


STRIPER DIARIES EPISODE 29

Ready, Set, Go!!! With reports of striped bass being caught in Raritan Bay, the plan was to head there on April 15, 2021 - opening day. The slot size is 28-35 inches and 1 fish per angler. With that in mind, it is time to load the boat and head out.

We broke East Rockaway (Deb's) Inlet at first light with the water flat and calm. The plan was to head west in about 30 feet of water, follow the beach and look for signs of life. I had not been to Raritan Bay since last spring, so I had my Raritan Bay/Jamaica Bay waterproof navigation chart in hand. Although my Garmin 7610 does adequately display my location, I prefer to keep a paper chart in arms reach when in unfamiliar territory. As we approached Breezy Point, we saw several boats in the distance. We





Once inside the lower bay, there are several things to be mindful of. The first is Ambrose Channel and Romer Shoal. As you continue inside the bay, you have to decide whether you will fish closer to Staten Island or New Jersey. As we slowly approached, we saw several boats fishing off Great Kills Harbor and Old Orchard Shoal. It's extremely important to watch your depths, as the water drops down to 4ft off Old Orchard Shoal. Another great option is to fish near Round Shoal, which is off Red Bank Beach. For those who want to fish closer to New Jersey, several great areas are Union Beach, Keansburg, Ideal Beach, or you can simply fish by the "hook."



Although I saw a fleet of boats, most of you know that I never fish in a fleet. I decided to look around and find my own fish. This is where learning your instruments is extremely important. We searched and searched and fi-

nally I saw marks! Set the lines up! We launched yellow and white mojos and started to troll. Within minutes the line peeled off. We were in!!! Fish on!!! We landed fish after fish of quality bass up to 27 inches. Fish were clean and healthy. What a great way to start the season!

By lunchtime we packed things up to head home. Safety is my number 1 priority and I am always concerned that the wind may pickup. We followed our tracks back to Deb's Inlet, and safely navigated home. Stay safe and until my next adventure, tight Lines.






PROPERTY COMMITTEE

FISHING REPORT

With a few boats in the water the reports are starting to slowly trickle in.

Striped Bass locally has seen the schoolie action pick up in all the back bays. For those making the run West to Raritan

there has been a mixed body of fish from schoolie's to fish hitting the 50lb. mark. Trolling and live lining have all been producing. These fish should be outside our inlet any day now — you will only know if you go. The bunker schools have also arrived and are as thick as they were last year.


Local reef action has seen good numbers of cod shorts and keepers, Ling and blackfish have all been caught as well.

There was some bluefin in the eastern canyons a few weeks back following a warm eddy. Other Canyon news has good catches of Golden Tilefish, Capt. Dave Pincus has had some quality catches on his past trips. Now is the time to make sure all your tackle and gear are in tip top shape.

For any North Shore members the western sound from Oyster Bay to the Throgs Neck bridge has been coming to life. Good quantities of school size striped bass are being caught in the shallow warm waters around docks and rock piles. Artificials fished slowly have been very successful. Bunker has also been in the area as well.

A MESSAGE FROM THE DEC

Some members are reporting dead and/or laboring Bunker in our back bays and canals. Apparently this has been going on since October '20. Christopher LaPorta from the DEC passed on the following information:

This observation is likely part of an ongoing marine mortality incident involving dead and dying Atlantic menhaden (Brevoortia tyrannus), also known as bunker, around Long Island, the Hudson River, and extending from Rhode Island to New Jersey. Throughout the region some menhaden have displayed irregular swimming behaviors (circling/twirling) or have been found dead. DEC and neighboring state agencies have been investigating, monitoring, and tracking this event since Fall of 2020.

DEC sent samples of tissue from collected fish to Stony Brook University's Marine Animal Disease Laboratory and Cornell University to test for a viral infection often associated with the observed, irregular, swimming behavior. New Jersey's Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) also sent samples of menhaden to Pequest Aquatic Animal Health Laboratory. Samples of menhaden collected by both states tested negative for the virus.

Additional investigations of affected fish by NJDEP found internal signs of disease associated with the presence of a Vibrio bacteria in most samples. This bacterium is a possible

cause of the mortality event. DEC is working to confirm this with additional samples from fish found in in New York this Spring. Vibrio bacteria are a naturally occurring bacteria in coastal waters that are typically present in elevated concentrations between May and October.

The specific bacterium identified by the NJDEP is not typically known to be harmful to humans. However, as a precaution, DEC recommends treating the situation the same as you would with any dead, wild animal. If you need to come in contact with dead fish to clean them up, make sure to wear appropriate protective equipment, including gloves.

There have been no reports of other fish or wildlife species being impacted by the suspected bacterium causing this mortality event. Menhaden occupy estuaries and coastal waters from northern Florida to Nova Scotia and are an important prey species for a wide range of wildlife and are typically used by humans as bait. It is still safe to eat fish that prey on menhaden. As always, it is recommended that all fish and shellfish be cooked to the proper temperature and fish that are dead or appear sick should not be collected or eaten.

DEC will continue to work with state and regional partners to further investigate this mortality event. As new information unfolds, the DEC will provide information to local governments and the public as necessary. Please continue to report fish kills by email to fishkillmarine@dec.ny.gov or call 631-444-0495 for marine waters or 845-256-3199 on the Hudson River.
