As a reminder, all slips we receive figure in our annual awards. So, even if you don't win a derby, get your fish weighed throughout the seasons and give us a fully completed slip. Remember: If we don't have a completed slip in hand, the fish did not exist. Striper Diaries EPISODE 38

Never leave fish to find fish. We have all heard the proverbial saying. Guess I simply forgot to follow my own golden rule. With reports of bass starting to show in our backyard in the usual spots i.e. 50ft. of

water off the roundhouse and pink hotel, I fueled up the boat (\$700 dollars later) and headed

out of Jones Inlet. There has been a lot of chatter about the "new" channel in Jones Inlet and the safest and best passageway in and out. I approached the inlet cautiously on the start of the outgoing tide. White water was breaking off into the distance in both directions. Oh boy. With my trust in the coast guard and the "new" marked buoys, we safely headed out. Disclaimer - two (2) nights earlier on a flat calm evening, I made my own tracks and waypoints following the "new" channel. I recommend members do the same, as Navionics and Garmin currently have no new

updates. The plan was to head west to Raritan Bay. It was roughly 25.5 miles before we approached Rockaway Inlet and other 5 miles across until we made our way into the bay. Water temps reached a high of 64 degrees.

As we motored around looking for bait and marks we could not find a thing. The screen was blank. Off into the distance we saw a fleet of boats. That looks promising! Upon arrival, we realized they were all fluke fishing. Oh nooooo. We are a month too late. Could the bite be over??? We trolled and trolled and trolled. Not even a touch. Then we switched to jigging the rips off Sandy Hook (not even sure that's a thing). Again, not a touch. What a bust. Time to switch gears. Luckily, we brought spearing and squid. A quick rig change and it was fluke time. We drifted for fluke for hours, and did not even land a short. What the heck is going on. By now it was mid-afternoon, and the turn of the tide. Great! Things should start to pickup on the incoming tide. Unfortunately, that was not the case. By late afternoon, and three sandwiches later, we decided to check out and head towards Rockaway inlet. There has to be fish holding in the jetty. Let's cast soft plastics and bucktails into the rips. Even that stunk. Ok, plan C. Let's search the entire ocean for bunker on the way back to Jones and work the live bait. Only problem was we could not find bunker. We were defeated. As the sun began to fade, we approached Jones Inlet. We had done a whopping 70.1 miles!! OUCH. As we turned the Point Lookout corner, I yelled to Pete - stop the boat! I am going to make one last cast!! Well, it was the best cast of the day. BAM - - just like that the line came tight and I was on a fish. GRAB the net, I have a fish!!! What kind he yells back?? Does it matter?? It's a fish, and all of a sudden I see stripes!! We jumped for joy as the fish was in the net. A nice keeper 29 inch bass!! What a way to end the day. I guess it's true that some days, fishing can be "just a boat ride." But not today. Until my next adventure. Tight lines.



Fishing Report

Fluke fishing started slow but the normal inside areas have been producing consistent catches. The new 18½" size has made it a little easier to box a few to bring home. I fished *the Hooker* in Reynolds and managed 6 nice

keepers to 20" with plenty of shorts in the mix.

The stripers have finally made their way East with good catches coming from the bays and finally outside Jones. Chris Lombardo has been catching well in the bay on lures, Barbara Solomon found a nice one just outside the inlet giving us all hope that the run is finally here. Also in the bay Chris Bellonzoni is off to a great start with many fish already tagged. Doug Tobak has

been putting some nice fish in the boat keeping the rods bending for his passengers.

Sea Bass have been biting at the reefs and still quite a few keeper cod being caught in the mix.

Reports of a good weakfish bite in the Merrick Bay area have been coming in.

Farther offshore the tilefish bite has been solid, Ken Donowski wrangled up quite the catch recently.

For anyone fishing the North Shore the striper bite has been the best we have seen in years, fish from 18"-45" are being caught. Lures, trolling, live lining bunker and chunking have all been productive.

The fluke tournament will be July 16th, weather day will be the 17th. Sign-ups began June 1st. Any questions please let me know.

You can't catch them if you don't have hooks in the water, go out and make your own report.


