# FISHING BULLETIN

It took until mid May for the action to take hold and let's hope that its all uphill from here. Although we are still being plagued with not so ideal weather, the month of May had a few better days than the months before it. Our club members chomping at the bit to get

out certainly took advantage of any inkling of a decent weather report. When they did the reports were decent enough to pay attention to and with that said our 2005 fishing season has finally started.

On the fishing front the waters have warmed up enough to inspire our targeted species to put the feedbag on. First on the menu this past month was the muchawaited fluke. It started with a bang according to past president Scott Schaffer his first trip was so-so but the second one was out of control. By 9:30AM that day they were limited out the biggest was 10.1 lbs. The next day Capt. Jim Krug accompanied by an entourage of club members sailed his Persuader to the promised land and reported phenomenal action with his biggest hitting the deck at 6lbs. Further to the west Mike Sullivan on his Blue Jacket II reported the same action lots of fish but not the big one. His catches have been consistent with fish also reported to 7.0 lbs. Our action out in front of our inlet, by the JI Bouy, started like gang busters with several large ones reported up to 12.0 lbs. Unfortunately they were not caught by any of our club members. The action has been spotty recently and as our weather settles down a bit this action will continue to rebound.

The local striped bass action has started as well. After an excellent presentation on the finer aspects of bass fishing by Chris Bellinzoni at our property, during a

recent Capt/Anglers gathering, his crew led the way by capturing first and second place during the clubs first shoot-out of the year. Impressed by the presentation, new club member Howard Moskowitz, did what any new member should be doing, getting involved with club members. He sailed recently with Chris aboard the Four Bells and caught his first bass of the season. The action on the outside has been excellent as well. The bunker schools are along the beach and the bass are under them. This past weekend Tony Testa Sr. sailed aboard his son's vessel the Stefani Ann and bagged a 35.0 lb bass employing this method. Further to the west the bass have been cooperating as well, schools of fish have been located under birds. Ralph Drewes reported that they had non-stop jigging action recently aboard his Oceanic the fish were reported to be all very decent size, the largest about 25lbs.

The bottom fishing has picked up as well as the sea bass have finally made their appearance. Last weekend Howard Berman sailed his vessel Aphis to the west with past presidents Ron Leonardi and John Hachman and reported sea bass in large numbers, there largest tipped the scale at 4.5 lbs. Local bottom expert Capt. Mike Zullo confirmed the same report about the sea bass, finally season has started.

Lastly our Off-Shore Chariots are ready for some blue water action. The beginning of June is the signal for most intrepid anglers to head out in pursuit of the season's first mako. Although the waters are still on the cool side, the reports from south Jersey indicated that the season has started. It won't be long before the "man in the blue suit" makes his or her appearance in our local waters.
