FISHING BULLETIN

The much-anticipated month of June has finally arrived. It is the

month that signals the start of our offshore fishing season, although this year some of us were treated to some early May offshore action, June is typically the month that our club boats ply the offshore waters. Prior to the Memorial Day weekend, we had been plagued with lots of east wind, which kept our offshore crews tied to the



dock. The opposite has been the case for our inshore crews, as they have been kept very busy catching striped bass in our areas local waters.

With a window of very conducive weather last weekend, club boat Findictive, skippered by new club member Rob Rosenberg accompanied by the FTC crew of Peter Cefai and Danny Carroll ran to a spot near the Hudson Canyon for a shot at the season's first mako. Shortly after arriving and setting up in the dark, they were treated to a blistering runoff. With all hands on deck each member assumed their roles and after an hour there trophy was along side the boat ready to be dispatched. A quick shot with the flyer and a tail rope and the first make of the 2006 season was tied up and a quite respectable one at that, back at the scale the fish weighed 290lbs. As the evening continued they caught and released a fair number of blue sharks and released another mako of over 200lbs. The next morning they trolled a pair of small bluefin, which were released. New blood draws first blood in 2006. Congratulations guys on an outstanding trip and what a way to crank up our offshore season. Another new member, tuna maven, Chris Gerhardt skippered his vessel Wasabi, under ideal conditions this past weekend to a spot near Wilmington Canvon. They were treated to a potpourri of tuna. Final tally for the trip was 3 YFT up to 30lbs. and 8 BFT, all released up to 50lbs. Another great trip Chris, keep up the good work.

PROPERTY

If you have visited the property lately, you may have noticed that the bulkhead is showing its age. The bulkhead was completed in 1968, almost 40 years ago. Bulkheads are expected to last about 25 years. Over the years, the Club made repairs to extend its useful life; tie rods in the 1980's and plastic sheeting in 2000. Even so, the bulkhead is clearly approaching the end of its useful life. In order to plan its replacement in an orderly manner, the Board has hired an engineering firm, Savik and Murray, to prepare plans and to begin the permit process. The Club expects to file for the required permits this winter and to begin work on the bulkhead in the winter of 2007-08. Mike Sullivan has volunteered to Chair a Working Group of six that will oversee the project. Other members include Chris Bellinzoni, Howard Berman, John Gerrity, Jim Rooney and Jeff Squeri. local striped bass population. I had the pleasure of joining the boats regular crew of Chris, Christopher, Al Casiano and his brother Charlie for some much-anticipated action. I was not let down. From the moment the bellies hit the water it was very steady action until the tide ebbed. Final tally for this trip was approx. 50 bass, the largest a very respectable 25lbs. We had excellent quality fish on this trip and a different strategy was employed after an exchange of information with club member, Paul Hilton. Paul is also leading the way this year with his most recently caught bass of 34lbs., he reports that the bunker are on the beach to the west and barring major boat traffic a mix of both bass and bluefish can be had.

Our fluke fishery has started with lackluster results at best. From Montauk the "land of fluke" to our local inlets the fishing has been nothing short of very disappointing. Fishing is 180 degrees from what it has been the last six seasons. Lets hope that this is a temporary situation and that at some point in the near future this fishery takes stronger hold.

The local Seabass action has also provided our club members with some steady action, most recently club members Paul Schuber and Bob Demeno teamed up to land a five gallon bucket of quality Seabass on the areas local reefs.

Seabass Recipes from Howard's Galley

Baked Sea Bass with Potatoes

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees. Coat the bottom of a casserole or baking dish with oil, then layer it with potato slices, overlapping them to cover the bottom completely. Arrange the fish on top of the potatoes, and arrange the tomato halves, cut side up, alongside the fish. Brush the tops of the fish and tomatoes plus any exposed potato slices, lightly with oil. Mix the garlic, parsley, green onions, rosemary, and thyme together well, then sprinkle over the fish. Lightly drizzle lemon juice over the garlic mixture, then salt and pepper to taste. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes, or until the fish and potatoes are done.

Barbecued Sea Bass

Rinse fillets in cold water; pat dry and sprinkle with salt, pepper, and paprika. Set aside. Place 2 slices bacon on a large piece of heavy-duty aluminum foil; place a bass fillet lengthwise on each bacon slice. Sprinkle 1/2 teaspoon lemon juice over each fillet. Fold foil edges over, and wrap securely. Repeat procedure with remaining ingredients to make 3 additional packets.

Grill packets over hot coals 10 minutes. Turn packets, and grill an additional 10 minutes or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork. 4 servings.
