

# DEEP WATER CANYON ANCHORING

#### **PART ONE**

Just in time for the Canyon Fishery is this two part article on Canyon Anchoring. When night starts to fall, it is the captain's duty to secure his vessel for the evening. In preparing for the overnight stay, he must adhere not only to the rule of law, but of common sense as well to ensure the safety of his crew, his vessel and of other boats that may be in the area. Finally, he also needs to keep a good fishing spot in mind. Knowing this... here is an overview of "Deep Water Anchoring" in the Canyons.

To start lets review the three overnight options that a night tuna fisherman has available to him: Tying to Commercial Fishing Gear, Drifting, and Anchoring.

# TYING TO COMMERCIAL LOBSTER & LONG LINE GEAR:

Commercial lobster gear is very easy to identity as each end of the lobster pot string is marked with a radar reflector high flyer and one or two A-3 Red Poly Balls with the owner's logo affixed. Long Line Commercial gear, which moves with the current, is usually just identified with a free floating radar reflecting high flyer and one poly ball. Also, down the line you may see bullet shaped floats, which aid in holding the long line near the surface.

Years back, tying onto commercial lobster gear was a common practice and there was never a strong objection from the Commercial Lobster Fisherman, AKA "The Landlord", because canyon traffic was light and times were different. As progress would have it, the ease of "tying off" is no longer a practical or a legal option, unless the owner of the gear gives you permission. Even with permission, law-enforcement can order you off. Restrictions on tying off to or tampering with any commercial gear are covered under federal, and in most states, local law as well. In a nutshell, these laws clearly state that tampering in any manor with commercially owned gear is strictly prohibited. In addition to the legal aspect, the last thing any captain needs in the middle of a fun event is a problem with the Landlord of the gear. These situations can become very tense and nerve racking to the boat owner and crew. If you are lucky enough to just get kicked off with a warning and no legal or hostile action, you will be still be forced into either an unprepared drift, or a night time anchor drop, which is not an easy task. The bottom line is that this gear is not for our use and it is illegal.

#### **DRIFT FISHING:**

Instead of anchoring, some captains may elect drift fish. Drift fishing on either calm nights or windy nights where the current is really ripping can be a very productive way of hooking up. With calm weather, you can easily move to where the fish might be, and then set up to drift with the current. This allows the baits to be set out with little or no weights on the line, giving them a more natural presentation. The action of the baits is similar to that of commercial long line fishing gear, just drifting with the current.

Should the weather turn to the evil side with a ripping current however, while the fishing can be very good, the night drift can become both hazardous and difficult. Hazards can vary from drifting into lobster pots and boats, to running over unseen commercial gear in the dark. So, while the drifting option can work, the conditions must be ideal, or you could truly have a trip to remember drifting in the deep!

#### **ANCHORING:**

Anchoring in the deep does require some skill and preparedness. It is truly nice to go out to the edge, find your own spot, claim it for night with your gear, and settle in with what are my number one priorities, safety and peace of mind! The last thing you want is for the anchor to slip in the middle of the night, which can become a real problem, not to mention a safety issue. I have been anchoring in the canyons for more years than I care to remember and have found the following Gear and Deployment Procedures have served me well.

# OFFSHORE ANCHORING SHOULD INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING;

Anchor: The Danforth Anchor is a good start. In selecting your Danforth Anchor I would recommend the Standards over the Hi Tensile or Deep Sets for the following reason. The anchor is the single most likely piece of equipment to suffer being lost in the deep water. The Hi Tensile anchors and Deep Sets, with their superior holding power, are made of much stronger hardware. Should a snag occur in rough bottom during the anchor lift, the Hi Tensile and Deep Set, with their superior strength, will be much less appt to bend and break free. With the Standard, you have a much better shot of bending the hook out and recovering all of your gear. Bent anchors can be straightened, lost ones needs no explanation. In addition the Standard anchor's holding power can be beefed up by adding more chain without decreasing your chances of recovering your gear from a snag.

Anchor line: You will most likely be anchoring your vessel in anywhere from 350 to 650 feet of water. Therefore you should have on board a total line length of 1800 feet of 3/8 or ½ inch diameter, depending on the size of your boat. For the line itself I like to shackle three 600 foot length together. Should I only need 1200' I just disconnect one tote of line. When shackling them together, each shackle should be taped. This allows the anchor ball ring to glide over the shackles during the lift without hanging up. Regarding the line size, 3/8" line for boats up to 35' is usually adequate for canyon fishing. The 3/8" diameter grabs less water than the ½' line because of its narrower profile. This allows for less drag on the anchor resulting in a smoother drop and anchor set. Also, the 3/8" line makes for easier storage and handling. We must also keep in mind that although 3/8' may seem a little light for some applications. when we anchor in the canyons, we are usually picking our weather with light winds.

That about wraps it up for part I....next month we will pick up where we left off with gear & deployment of ground tactical.
