

Summer Approaches Let the games begin!

The weather has been disappointing but some good fishing opportunities presented themselves in May. Reports by FTC members were sparse, but I'll attempt to piece together what happened in May and what we can look forward to in June. It is hard to believe, but the next reports will likely include shark tournament results, catches of tuna, and hopefully some much needed summer weather.

On the inshore scene, bass have worked their way east to Montauk and beyond. Clam chumming for stripers is viable in many areas, particularly around Jones and Fire Island Inlets, but the large fish (up to nearly 50 lbs.) have mostly been caught on the troll from the Rockaway's East to Jones Inlet and out to 50+ of water. Be aware that possession of striped bass in federal waters is prohibited, and some of the areas where the action occurs can exceed the 3 mile limit. Also, catching a few bass and running deeper to do some fluking or other bottom fishing with bass onboard is a no-no. I have been approached and boarded in federal waters several times over the past few years and all they seem to care about is whether or not you have bass on board, be advised...

The very popular and now famous Mojo rigs have accounted for many large fish, however the presence of bluefish, and the damage they inflict to the Mojo's has many returning to trolling their venerable bunker spoons. They are producing and withstand the attacks of toothy fish much better than the Mojo. We are once again blessed with a good bunker population and live lining has produced and should continue to produce well into the summer. Large fish seem plentiful, good luck landing that trophy, the chances of landing a 50+ should be pretty good this year.

Fluke were available from opening day with the usual back bay areas producing fluke of mixed sizes. Some nicer 5-6 lb fish have started showing up, and the ocean is starting to produce as well including

fish on hard bottom. Pete "Off the Hook" found Cefai some nice fish of 5 lbs + fishing close to home. recently, caught to the west. Good luck to all in the FTC Fluke Calcutta, should be interesting!

While we await the opening of the seabass season in NY waters,



I can tell you that population large and those targeting porgies, ling, and cod are having trouble avoiding them. I did a trip a few weeks looking for a stray cod or two

in the 80 foot depths. The seabass were stacked high on the machine and I continued to read and catch (and release) them well off the structure. Nothing else had a chance that day. However, by finding the right depth to fish (avoiding the seabass) ling, porgies, and some cod are available as well as catch and release blackfish. Seabass regulations for NY have not yet been set, however, it seems like start of the season may be status quo, with the later months still up in the air. With the amount of seabass in our waters in May, it's hard to believe they won't let us keep a few until June 27th, and take some pressure off of other, less abundant species.

As for our beloved winter flounder, some feel the season was an improvement over the past few years, particularly to the west.

Captain Jim Krug, went on a "dinosaur hunt" out at Montauk. I didn't get the full report but he caught at least one large one.

The Flounder season closed as of May 30th.

This past week a Mako was taken south of Long Island, lots of blue dogs showing up, tuna have been captured as well. Let the offshore season begin, good luck and stay safe out there!

By the way, I did manage to go fishing last Friday for fluke. Not a great day, but my son caught the only keeper fluke out of 35+ fisherman. Well worth the price of admission from where I was standing.
