


### **Fishing Report**

### Striper Diaries EPISODE 39

MECCA. Time to pack the camper, boat, trailer and all our fishing gear and head to Montauk. What else would one do when the fishing is slow in our own backyard. With dreams of 50 pounders we hit the open road. The plan was to live off the land, go off the grid and follow the migration. We arrived at Montauk Anglers Club on East Lake Drive, 4 hours later with the boat in tow. I can't

say enough good things about Suzy, Rose and the entire crew. This full service marina is a home run, with a great ramp, showers, and a full restaurant to cook your catch. Since getting a late start, and sitting in traffic for 4 hours, we finally launched the boat at 3pm. We headed out of the "harbor" with thoughts of big, big fish. The plan was to bucktail the rips... apparently there are many many rips - - most of which I am not familiar with. Time to check the chart. As we approached the lighthouse, the sky turned black and the heavens opened up with rain and wind. The rips by the lighthouse were huge. Big, big waves cresting with a wind chop on top. Oh boy. After a few minutes the storm passed, and we were able to set up on the drift. Bam! Right away gator blues. They were everywhere. We played catch and release until our arms hurt. Time to head in.

The next morning, we planned to jig again. We heard the porgies in Montauk are the size of basketballs. No bait needed, as I wanted to land some bigens on a 3.5 oz metal jig. Wow, the rumors were all true. We jigged up 16 inch porgies, some striped bass and some 18 inch sea bass!!! What a day. Every so often we saw birds dive bombing on bait and the waves were lit up with blue fish. Casting and "run and gunning" till our arms were sore. It doesn't get better than that. Finally, we switched gears in hopes of landing a 50 pounder. Reports from local charter captains showed big bass being landed everyday on live bait. So, with that in mind, we focused on drifting live bait on a three-way rig with an extra long leader. We rode around until we spotted some locals. We were not looking to "mug" their spot, we simply wanted to watch and learn. Boy were we schooled. We set up on the drift just as they were. Every drift they were doubled over with hookups. All of the bass way too large to keep. We watched in disbelief. What were we doing wrong? We changed our rig, put on a fresh bait, maneuvered the boat the same way and nada. We did not land one single fish - - although we did see a 50 pounder follow the bait to the boat. We felt defeated, but were determined to fish the remainder of the tide. As they reeled and reeled their patrons were shouting with joy and slapping high fives. We were humbled for sure. The Montauk bite is not for the weary. It's really big water, an extremely fast current and rolling swells for days. As the sun set, it was time to head back. We may not have landed a 50 pounder, but we filled our cooler with sea bass, porgies and learned a lot of information. That was good enough for us.


