President's Message


Dear Members.



FISHING BULLETIN

Captain Harry Weinblatt F/V Blue Marlin

We are entering the second half of the year and with our summer fisheries now well underway, I am certain that the thought of how the rest of our season is going to fare has crossed the minds of all FTC members. Will 2009 be a successful fishing season for the FTC? Only time will tell. Traditionally the onset of southerly winds during the month of June transforms our waters into a conduit for which our pelagic species use as a vehicle to move through our area. The lack of winds from this direction has stalled this process and as a result our offshore waters have been kept below 65 degrees as evidenced by the lack of green water. The many weeks of east wind which materialized during the month of June have uncharacteristically changed our local offshore waters into an aquarium of action for our FTC Fleet. The excellent start to our shark fishery by an inundation of blue sharks has been dampened by the lack of Makos and Thresher Sharks. My opinion which is based on a similar situation some 25 years ago; is that the month long rains that we have experienced have lowered the salinity levels of our local offshore waters. This in turn has inhibited the infiltration of these other shark species in more noticeable numbers. This has been brought to light by the many sub-two hundred pound makos which are being caught on a regular basis by vessels committing to overnight stays during their canyon tuna trips. It seems that these fish headed east and not north noting the presence of fresh water from the Hudson River trench which runs along the northerly springtime migration route for this species. The makos in this size class are typically the ones that we target. They are staying particularly further offshore this season and this may be the reasoning.

On the offshore scene the kick off to our Shark fishery started with a bang. Capt. Larry Festa skippered his vessel Kristen on blustery June 6th morning and left for home with 12 less shark tags in his tagging kit later that same afternoon. The very next day the Hooker and Shark Hunter were on the same grounds and reported lock and load action with very hungry blue sharks. They too came home with less shark tags than they left that morning with. The following weekend our FTC shark fleet experienced the same action once again. The reports of Threshers and Mako's which emanated from Delaware and South Jersey had our FTC shark fisherman literally waiting with baited breath. The Woodcleft Tournament started out with high expectations based on the southern reports; they were later dispelled as the lack of radio chatter was indicative of what would be on the scales by days end. Congratulations are in order for Harry Schroder and the crew of the Just Add Water. There 121 lb. Mako earned them a second place finish in this years tournament. The rest of the tournament participants were engaged a game of tag and release with the multitude of blue sharks which were ever present in everyone's chum slicks. The same level of enthusiasm was the case for the FTC Fleet once again the following weekend for the Hudson Anglers Shark Tournament. The action on this day was slow for most vessels. The majority boats reporting a few blue sharks again and only one eligible make and no threshers, a major disappointment for all tournament participants. Another congratulation is in order and three times (three canyon trips) are a charm. That is what Chris Gerhart and Hank Jenet said after boating the 2009 seasons first Tuna of the Year. A Yellowfin Tuna caught by the captain himself, which weighed in at an even 42lbs. This fish was one of twenty on that day was brought home for the scale; the balance of the catch was released to fight another day. This action was in the vicinity of Toms Canyon and all fish where caught trolling.

On the inshore scene Seabass continue with reckless abandon. The fish are not monsters, however when one works at it a decent catch

can be put together. Pork Chop sized Porgies have also become part of this catch when targeting the seabass and even a cod or two has found their way into a cooler for the way home. Striped bass continue to cooperate however the action has shifted to the ocean as larger fish have been caught both east and west of our inlet amongst the bunker schools which can be present along our local beaches from Fire Island Inlet to the Rockaway's on any given day. Prior to the closing of the fluke season I received an e-mail from fellow club member Ray Geiger along with FTC member Harry Sbaschnig they had a great day catching and releasing 80 short fluke. The fish were caught on green gulp shad and white gulp squid. Now that this fisheries closed season is open; lets hope that we have a repeat performance of our season from last year.

CONSERVATION

Fluke season has been re-opened for July 3rd then August 27th. The limit is two fish at 21½ inches. Recently, anglers have been confused by some boats fishing from fluke during the closure with a special permit. These boats purchased the right to fish for the Federal Government through an auction. Each year a percentage of the fisheries are held as a Research Set Aside. This RSA has been sold by the Feds to generate income for research projects (presumably?). Some boats chose to participate if they feel the price is right!

Two years ago, the Viking bought the rights to fish for Porgy for two months after the early October closure. They did very well. Last year the Laura Lee paid for September/October Fluke and there were few fish around. This year the RSA limit was four f ish at 20 inches. Who keeps track of the catch I don't know for sure. I know the cost was about \$3 a pound.

Dangerous business! You pay for a Salt Water License and then you buy the "privilege" to fish from the Federal Government. There currently is a bill that would result in all of us buying the fish we intend to catch. This is what happens when the government thinks the people aren't paying attention!
