#### Summer Time - Rodeo Time

At last Months General Meeting we were entertained by Capt. James Schneider. He runs the party boat the James Joseph on the North Shore out of Huntington. He has fished the north shore his entire life and captaining his party boat for 30 years, harvesting Fluke since the early 70's with his father Bob Schneider. Captain James told us how he targets large fluke on the north shore. He was very informative. I'd like to thank board member Ray Geiger our entertainment chairman for scheduling another great speaker!

I'd like to take this time to talk about our club and the financial situation we are in. In years past our general meetings attendance averaged 80 plus members each month. In 2012 we averaged 56 members. Every month we loose revenue because we do not have enough attendance from the membership. Last months general meetings attendance was poor with only 45 members which was VERY LOW! At our last Board Meeting we had a vote to raise the admission fee at the door. The vote passed and now the admission at the door will be \$12. We must try to make the General meeting become self sustaining so please support your club by attending the meetings each month and buying raffle tickets.

On a financial note which I had addressed in the beginning of my presidency, about our property taxes, in 2006 our taxes were about \$37,000. At that time the property was self sufficient. The taxes have been continually increasing over the years. In 2009 we rebuilt the property. We had Approx. 450 feet of new bulkhead installed, floating docks with water and electric on the floats, walkways ,and new decking for a TOP NOTCH MARINA for the FREEPORT TUNA CLUB TO BE PROUD OF! We did have to finance this with a mortgage on the property. In 2012 the taxes rose to \$52,000. This is a MAJOR Increase and based on prior years we are slated for another increase to \$58,000. Our current taxes and expenses drastically exceed our income. The board of directors along with our attorneys are working on our tax challenges, but we as a club have to HELP anyway we can because otherwise there might not be a club here in the future. So if you "LOVE" this club as much as I do, then we as members of this club have to PARTICIPATE and SUPPORT it!

Last year we had a special raffle for an 8 foot inflatable boat powered by a 3 ½ Horsepower Tohatsu outboard motor that was won by our editor Capt. John J. Jutt. The boat raffle was in association with South Shore marine Supply and the funds that were raised paid for two boats. This year we have a 9 ft. inflatable boat powered by a 5 horsepower Tahatsu outboard motor, and this boat and motor is ours free and clear, and all the profits go to the Freeport Tuna Club. The tickets are only \$10 each. There are almost 200 members in this great club, so if 100 members each took a book of 10 tickets and sold them to self, family and friends or at their jobs, we could bring in \$10,000 profit for the Tuna

Club!. Now THAT'S WHAT I'M TALKING ABOUT! Call me on the phone and leave a message with your name and address and I will personally mail you tickets (516) 781-4011. SUPPORT THE CLUB....SAVE THE FTC...IT'S REAL IMPORTANT!!

enjoy and a DJ. We will have our Capt. Anglers crew cooking up some of the best dishes around. The July meeting will be combined with the Rodeo. 
SAVE THE DATE Aug. 17 & 18th is our annual FLOATILLA at ZACH'S BAY.

### **Fishing Report**

SHARK!..........The season is in full swing. Talk about starting off with a bang. Our 2013 shark season to date is one of our best ever.

To my amazement with such cool green water the blue sharks, makos & threshers arrived in great numbers. As of mid-June just about every one of our local honey holes have been producing quality makos & threshers. The areas that have been productive were: The Glory Hole, HA, Mudhole, Rock Plies II & III, Mako Hotel, Yankee, 30 fathoms, 20 fathoms. Just about every spot from120' out to 180' are holding quality fish.

### Some very fine fish of note are:

Captain Harry Schroeder, angler 292 Mako; Hudson Anglers #1 winner.

Sean Libby F/V "Aurora" with a 140 Mako caught late during the Hudson Anglers Tournament.

Captain Chris Bellinzoni, christened the new "Four Bells" with a 151 Mako at the Rock Plies.

Captain Dava Massa F/V Shark Hunter" with a Woodcleft 158 Mako.

Captain Harry Weinblatt also christens his new "Blue Marlin" with a 193 Thresher at the Mako Hotel.

Captain Nick Nero,  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{F/V}}$  " Dolice Vita" with his personal best 158 Mako also at the Mako Hotel.

Captain's Joe Principato & Hank Jenet F/V "Afishscent" did the double hat trick at the Mudhole with a 168 & 158 Mako.

Captain John Jutt did a maiden voyage trip; post Woodcleft Tournament with a fine catch of two released Makos est 100 lbs. and a keeper 200 (EST) Thresher also at the Mako Hotel.

Captain Dave Pincus, F/V "Canyon Lady" with a 238 Woodcleft Thresher.

The weekend of June 29th ~ 30th, which should have been prime time for sharking was a weather blow-out. Both days flagged small craft advisors which pushed the Bay Shore Shark Tournament back the July 13th. Montuak Marine Basin on the other hand had the tournament. A 377 Mako took 1st place honors on the F/V Joy Sea with a net of 105k!

Despite the forecast double header" Makoman" FTC Captain Joe Principato gave the offshore sharking a look. Joe Sailed to the 20 fathom curves. He reported sporty but very fishable conditions. His trip however only produced a small released Mako. Joe stated that the water was still green and that the water temperature increased to 69 degrees. The increase in temps was due to our very strong south flow of wind. Captain's Joe & Hank did a 2nd trip this past July 7th to the Linda area. Once again warm green water only produced a few dusky sharks.

This pasted July 6th Point Look Out sponsored its 1st shark tournament. The bite was not that good do to the strong s/w flow and waters warming quickly into the 70 degree mark. No FTC Boats made the scales. However the FTC was represented with the following FTC Boats: Captain Mike Lobosco F/V " Mikey Like's It", Sean Libby F/V

"Aurora", Chris Bellinzoni F/V " Four Bells" & Nick Nero F/V " La Dolice Vita" The #1 & #2 fish were both threshers @ 219 & 148 lbs. Reports of Makos were scares with Duskys & Hammerheads moving into the warm water.

It is my belief that this red hot sharking that we have seen will be coming to a close do to the water green water that has arrived during this past two week s/w flow. However based on the start our spring shark derby will be one for the record books.

On the bassing front here are the reports:

From Captain Paul Noto:

"First 2 weeks of June we did about 5 live bait trips...Bait was around Jones but very spotty and skittish of the boat... We had slow action averaging about 3 fish per trip... most fish were in the 15lb- 29lb range .. One of the trips featured Captain Harry Weinblatt as the "Ringer"... Harry had 3 fish ...the biggest going a couple ounces under 30 lbs!!! Another trip I was joined by Bob Bohlert and Dave Massa.. Bob had the only fish weighing about 15 lbs.-- we had quite a few opportunities at fish but the bass seemed more interested in "playing" with the bait than eating...

Water in the low to mid 60s and horrible quality... Where are the blue fish?

We are still waiting on some quality bass to arrive... I hope they didn't pass us by migrating towards their summer vacation up North....I have some first-hand reports of Bass off Cape Cod in the 40lb Range.. We will see".

Captain Joe Masseria reports that the west bar on Jones is producing nice strip bass. On a recent trip using bunker chunks as opposed to clam bellies, Joe had strippers up to 30 lbs.

Captain Pete Cefai and Barbara Solomon trailer their center console to breeze point and bunker chunked several quality bass all released by not by choice.

Offshore Tuna Report:

From Captain Chris Wasbie:

"Inshore BFT seem to be just showing up, and not in any great numbers. We've been networking with guys sharking, and looking for tuna as well. We've gone a few times, including this past Saturday to the GH, CC, AP, Triple Wrecks, Bidevin, and Tower. We found a good break, whales, bait, birds, slicks, sharks, but not tuna.

We had guys looking at the Bacardi, Tower, and even the Hudson. Not much going on with tuna so far.

Couple guys have spotted schoolie size BFT in the compass rose and triple wrecks while sharking, but none of those hooked up. A friend had a 50# and couple midgets by the AP about two weeks ago. I think a couple Jersey Guys may have had a few by the Resor Wreck last weekend, but very slim pickens, so far.

Waiting on some decent water to hit any canyon from Block to the Lindy, but nothing so far."

On July 8th Captain Paul Noto gave did an offshore tuna trolling trip. Paul sailed to the Virginia Wreck area & south then east along the 30 fathom curve. Paul reported very warm 75 degree green water with no life at all. There were a few draggers but no tuna were seen, marked or hooked up.

### **Fluking Fishing:**

Both Captain's Mike Zullo & Jim Krug report very good fluke action in our local back bays. Both captains have managed good catches of keeper fluke along with some quality weakfish. In addition to the back bays Reynolds's Channel and west to the golf course are also holding nice fluke

Captain Joe Masseria, F/V Miss Lynn reports hit and miss action on and around the Hemsptead Reef. Two trips produced 8 keeper fluke up to 7 lbs. On the annual "Duke of Fluke" Contest three FTC Boats sail. Captain Bob Sabella F/V "Old Sam", Captain Joe Masseria F/V "Miss Lynn" & Captain Joe Desalvo F/V "Gail Force". With the high winds all boats were force to fish in the back bays. The bulk of the keeper fluke scaled at 4 lbs. with the #1 fish coming in at 8 lbs.

Captain Joe & his son Joe Jr. did manage to make the scales. Joe Jr. came in 2nd place with a 3.39 lb. fluke in the junior division & Captain Joe placed 12th with a 4.24 lb. fluke.

On July 4th Captain Bill Morrogh F/V "Margaritabill" tried outside for Fluke to see if fishing had improved. No dice. Doggies at Macalaster, tankers and zip at Hempstead reef.

Don Granger also fished outside to the Trench, Macalaster Banks, the tankers & the coal wreck with no keeper fish.

Other members reported better results inside but boat traffic made that not an option by the afternoon.

Ken kapner and Rick Hiners reported mostly shorts with a few keepers mixed in fishing inside our inlet.

### **Offshore Wreck fishing:**

Captain Ralph Drewes reported a slammer offshore cod trip on a friend's boat, July 6th with Cod to 20 lbs.

### Out East Montauk report:

At Montuak I fished fluke both days with Captain Anthony Testa F/V Stefanie Ann. With high winds the south side was not an option so we fished the north side and managed 7 keepers.

Captain Mike Sullivan Reports:

"The Bluejacket II sailed Sunday night to fish the June full moon off the Point.

On board were Charlie Goldstein and me. With the 20-25 knot south west wind, traffic was light; we joined about 8 other boats. Things calmed down at dusk and it turned into a beautiful night. Getting bait was a challenge (we managed only two pieces). My experience has been when bait is difficult to come by, the bite is good. We jigged a couple of keeper bass in the first half hour of the flood. Once the current got going, we deployed the porgies and boated a 25 lb and a 30 lb fish. They jumped on these baits; two bad we only had two. Charlie managed one fish on an eel after dark. Five fish to 30 lb- not what we had hoped for, but an ok bite".

In addition Captain Mike night bass fish July 5th tagging and releasing three quality bass on live bait.

On the late vacation catches; Treasurer John Daum reported a 42 lb. Black Grouper on June 1st during his vacation trip to Islamorada. This fine catch was only 6 lbs. short of our club record which was set in 1955 by George Sarani in Marathon Florida.


