

June Fishing Summer and Fish Settle In...

Summer appears to have finally arrived and the July 4th weekend is behind us. Many will spend it boating and fishing and a lot of good opportunities present themselves. If you like bottom fishing, June was a good month to put together a full cooler with a tasty mixed bag consisting of fluke, ling, porgies, and finally seabass. The opening of the seabass season was long awaited as the population seems to be at an all-time high. The season opened on June 27th, with a 3 fish bag limit and 15" minimum size, subject to change so be aware. Seabass fishing is red hot so get them while you can.



Fluke are available just about everywhere, from the back bays to the inlet and outside on both open bottom and structure.

Earlier in the month, Don Granger had Charlie Goldstein aboard Don's *Splitshot* for some ocean fluking. They had a couple of fish over 5 pounds. Just yesterday, I did a quick trip and was able to catch a solo limit of fluke and seabass on small structure in the 60' depths, despite tough wind against tide conditions requiring the use of 12 oz sinkers.

The population of resident striped bass seems healthier this year, and fish and being clam chummed in the back bays and at the bridges. Outside, catches of generally larger striped bass continue primarily to the west both live lining bunker and on the troll. Several sharp charter boats seem to limit everyday on large fish up to nearly 50 lbs. Bob Bohlert sent a report on a trip he took with Paul Noto on Paul's *Rocketfish*. Fishing to the west, Bob landed a nice 34 lb 10 oz specimen on a live bunker. Bob retuned to the same area the following evening, but the fish had moved on. I'm not that tuned in to the striped

bass scene, but the fishing close to JI seems to be slower than we are accustomed to, that could change at any moment so be prepared.


season has passed, some nice fish were weighed in during the Point Lookout and Hudson Tournament. The Woodcleft was cancelled and we all wish Ritchie Rosenkranz a speedy recovery.

During the Star Island Tournament at Montauk a catch was made that bears mentioning. Captain Steve Rhodes and his boat the Professional Cryer are no stranger to big sharks. During the tournament they hooked, landed and brought a 780 Mako to the scales. Unfortunately, they could not make the weigh-in because the fish was hooked late. I have met and fished with Steve through Captain Jim Krug who provided the picture. Congratulations Captain Steve and crew for landing the fish of a lifetime.

Closer to home, Freeport Tuna Club members have been busy too. I received the following report: Captain Chris "Four Bells" Bellinzoni and Angler Al Casciano capturing the Lawrence J. Festa award for the Club's First Mako of the year. The 134 lb. fish was captured from 64 degrees water 41 miles south of Jones Inlet after three spectacular jumps. Wireman Steve Valenti and Bob Bohlert rounded out the Four Bells full Freeport Tuna Club crew. Those attending our Captain Anglers' Meeting on June 22nd enjoyed Mako-kabobs brought to the club by the Chris' crew the same day the fish was harvested. Congrats to Chris and crew, this is the second time the Four Bells has captured the award since the untimely passing of Captain Larry.

On the trip home, the crew performed a good deed coming across and freeing a turtle tangled in a throw ring with a light attached. The throw ring and light were apparently from a research vessel out east, where they were washed overboard during rough seas. Stow your gear securely! Congrats to the *Four Bells* Capt. and crew, good job!



Our editor, Captain John Jutt ran his *Red Dawn Rising* to a productive area where they batted blue sharks all day. I joined him on another trip to the same area, along with Steve "*Bassman*" Bassford and John's brothers Tommy and Jimmy. It was a slow day with a couple of Makos checking us out but completely uninterested, weird. A small brown was released late in the day. We heard of a hammerhead taken nearby, the water is warming ...


On the tuna scene, some great catches of mixed YFT and BFT are being reported south of us, in the Baltimore Canyon vicinity. Closer to home, BFT have been getting the spotlight with small to medium fish reported from the Chicken Canyon/ Texas Tower area out to the Hudson Canyon.



Another good report from Chris Bellinzoni: "Captain Bruce Forster's pushed his *Oh Reely* off 63 miles to the south west into 170' of water to find 68 degree water and pods of sand eels. With a good amount of bird life, whales and porpoises in the area Bruce and his crew with Chris "Four Bells" Bellinzoni getting some rare rod time, managed a 27lb BFT trolling a wide array of offers in the spread. Purple spreader bars were the ticket in a 3-5' wind swept chop."

A late report from Captain John Jutt of the Red Dawn Rising leaving at 1AM to catch early bight in the Texas Tower Area. Went on the troll at first light, a 70 with an 8oz Joe Chute and Ballyhoo on the center rigger starts screaming. After a long fight, angler Steve Bassford brings a large BFT to the boat that measured 60" and 109 lbs on the scale.

Your hard work and diligence pay off, congrats to Captain John and crew.




Julene Knot

The Trilene Knot is an all-purpose connection to be used in joining monofilament to swivels, snaps, hooks and artificial lures. The knot's unique design and ease of tying yield consistently strong, dependable connections while retaining 85-90% of the original line strength. The double wrap of mono through the eyelet provides a protective cushion for added safety.

- Run end of line through eye of hook or lure and double back through the eye a second time.
- Loop around standing part of line 5 or 6 times.
- Thread tag end back between the eye and the coils as shown.
- 4. Pull up tight and trim tag end.
