WHERE'S THE FLUKE??!!!









With the arrival of summer, fluke should be plentiful on the south shore of Long Island by now. But it seems there are no keeper fluke around. Reports from the AB reef to the Fire Island reef are few and far in between. Plenty of seabass are around in large numbers caught for anglers taking there time to get to them through the shorts.

I myself have witnessed first hand there are few keepers around. If you are looking for keepers I suggest you fish from Shinnecock to Montauk point, where I myself limited out with fish to 7lbs. Congrats to Mike Sullivan for catching a 9lb. fluke in Montauk.

Anthony Scarpontino and friends fished the 20-30 phantom line. Had 5 fish to 100 lbs. and got spooled by 1 that eventually broke the 250 lb. clip (terminal tackle failure). Overall, A great day of fishing.

As for the offshore report, life is plentiful out there with Dave Pincus and crew heading back from a successful Canyon trip with loads of yellowfin caught. Put the breaks on the Canyon Lady to a scretching haul deployed the

spreader bars and within 15 mins he had a 70 lb. bluefish onboard.

Adam Bollaci and crew also had 60-80 lb. tuna fishing the Coimbra in the AM on squid bars. There


are a lot of tuna offshore right now.

As for the sharking scene... Dave Massa went fishing aboard the Shark Hunter with Hank and Chris. They had 4 makos and a 228 lb. thresher shark. The fish hit a bluefish and skirt 90 ft. down. She gave several jumps before she was subdued.

Hal Joseph was aboard his boat, the Theresa J, with his sons Rob and Chris when

they caught a 166 lb. thresher. They were $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south east of the gunboat. His sons fought it and brought it in while he was on the wheel.

STRIPER DIARIES

With opening day of Sea Bass approaching, all I could think about was finally doing some wreck fishing. Time to grab a nautical chart, check Terrafin and some other local weather websites.

I decided to take off Monday, June 24, instead of fishing opening day, as I

didn't feel like competing with all the weekend warriors. With my light bottom fishing rod in hand, and a bucket of fresh clam, we headed out of Deb's Inlet. The ocean was flat and there was not another boat in site. Ahhh perfect! A quick stop at a local secret spot produced a ton of sea bass in the 13-14 inch range. That's it, lines up. We need to head into deeper water in search of big fish. We went approximately 8 miles south east past the Cholera Bank to an area near the Irma C and Florence. Water depth was approximately 120 ft deep. We hopped around from wreck to wreck and were able to put together a nice catch of keeper sea bass and ling, with tons of double headers over the rail. What a great day.

On Wednesday night June 26, around 9 p.m. I received a phone call from Capt. Dave, who runs the Tail Hooker out of Montauk. Did I want to load the car and drive out to Montauk in the morning for a day of fluke and sea bass fishing?? Ummm honey, is it okay if I call in sick again this week and go fishing?

We loaded the truck, packed some turkey sandwiches and hit the road. When we arrived at Gone Fishing Marina in Montauk, (which is now called Montauk Anglers Club & Marina) it looked like pea soup. Without hesitation, we loaded the boat and started to head out. I don't even think we thought twice about heading out in the fog. We rounded Shawgwong, Treasure Hole and were nearing the point. The next thing I know the boat comes to a screeching halt and we are grounded near the North and False Bar. Pea soup fog, and rips surrounding us, on what I now see is the end of the outgoing tide. It was in that moment that I grabbed my life jacket and we made call to the Coast Guard. It's a very strange feeling, when you are in unfamiliar waters and in harms way. It was at that time, that we asked the captain what type of safety gear was on the boat. Pete Cefai was quick to remove the back hatches and fish boxes to check if we were taking on water. Luckily we were not. Soon thereafter, the wind picked up and by the grace of god we were able to back out of the shallow rips into deeper water. We proceeded slowly through the fog to the fluke grounds which the captain said was "8 miles out." Truth is, I would have been happy porgy fishing at the Shagwong Reef, where I could see land. Guys, even the most seasoned captain can get disoriented in the fog. The time to ask questions and check safety gear is BEFORE you leave the dock. Also, always check the tides. Areas that are safe at high tide can be treacherous at dead low.

When we arrived at the fluke grounds, the fog began to lift and the sun came out. Thank God. We baited up with spearing, squid and gulp combos. The fishing was hot and within a few hours we limited out on fluke and sea bass. By 3 p.m. we were ready to head back. No mistakes this time, as we stayed way off the beach for the ride back in.

Back at the marina just in time to filet the fish for dinner. There is a small restaurant attached to the marina where they will cook your fish for \$15.95 per pound. Sounds like a plan to me! We gave them all the fish we caught and were greeted with an assortment of fish tacos, and panko fried fluke. It was delicious! By the time we finished eating dinner it was nearing



9:00 p.m. and was time to hit the road back to Freeport.
