.eaving off from last months fishng bulletin was the start of our lue-water season and what a start t was. Soon after July 4<sup>th</sup> the dinier bell started to ring. Our club embers experienced the best

shark fishing we have had here in quite some time with an abundance of mako's and threshers, our members were not bashful in bringing them back to the scale. The first "official" mako of the season was caught by Captain John Jutt aboard the "Bunker Dunker" and weighed in at 149lbs. One week later, Ralph Drewes aboard the Oceanic weighed one in at a respectable 190lbs that same day Larry "The Legend" Festa brought in a 201 lb thresher. Later in the week Matt Errett nailed a 167lb. Mako. During the Chris Larkin tournament Ralph Ortiz and crew landed a 181 lb. mako, good enough to earn his crew third place in that division. The action did not stop there as concurrent with the shark action was the vast acres of bluefin tuna that were blasting there way through our area. Members reported stopping to catch a tuna and then set out a chum slick to then catch a shark or two. Anton Gerdes aboard his boat "Extremes" landed an impressive bluefin of 142lbs. out by the Texas Tower. This action unfortunately came to an end, a weeks worth of Southwest wind and our action became a memory. All of the blue water was blown away and replaced with water of the greenish tint lacking the necessary ingredients to continue to spawn this outrageous action. Congratulations are also in order as the team of the "Lady E" posted yet another victory during the recent outing of the Babylon Invitational Tournament. Their 97lb Yellowfin was good enough to give them first place and all the money that goes along with it.

Our local striped bass action continues to provide decent action as well. The better action has been in the ocean fishing with whole clams. The catches have been reported both east and west of our local inlet.

On the inshore scene our fluke fishing has rebounded again. Last week **Paul Hilton** single handidly skippered his "**Emily S**" during a not so nice afternoon and limited out in less than an hour of fishing. This past weekend members reported that they had excellent action with quality fish up to 7lbs. The action has been straight out of our inlet in waters that range in depth from 60 –90ft. Lastly congratulations are in order for **Ron Leonardi's** 10lb. Fluke, which he caught during a recent trip.

As the month of August continues we can only hope that our offshore action picks back up and that there is hope of a bite that will soon start in the Canyons. Our blue water chariots are waiting to have 100 fathoms of water beneath them.


