FISHING BULLETIN

he beginning of July showe ing signs of an early canyon b ever this fishing has slowed up c ably as the fish have not yet down and taken up residenc the offshore grounds. As the month of August draws close we can just hope that Mother Nature will allow the prime ingredients to continue to form



and that this fishing will take on a more consis-

tent pattern. Throughout the month of July we have had several days of easterly-south easterly winds. This direction of wind is conducive to carrying oxygen rich blue water inshore. This water type makes a very comfortable habitat for pelagic species. A fairly large patch of this water has replaced the dull green water that had previously taken up residence around the 20-fathom curve as our waters warmed up rapidly during the later part of June into early July.

Upon reviewing the off-shore temperature charts in early July, Captain Chris Squiere

Ran the "Lady E" 120 miles to meet a patch of blue water that was alive with yellowfin tuna. His crew boated 18, keeping their limit up to 75lbs. Also reacting to the same information club president Scott Schafer skippered his 50/50 to the same area catching 6 fish upto 75lbs as well.

Although tuna were not in my sights, acting on a tip from an "old-time friend" I ran my vessel to the West Side of the Hudson Canyon in mid-July accompanied by club members John Jutt and Paul Hilton for a little tilefish action. Drifting in the 450-foot depths with 4/0's and 50-lb. fireline resulted in 64 fish up to 12lbs.

Shark fishing, in our local waters, has fallen into its typical summertime pattern with an abundance of small makos in the 30-100 lb. range being caught. Lets practice our conservation measures and release these fish, under 100 lbs., so that they may grow up and spawn. During his maiden voyage, aboard his new vessel John Coleman and crew landed their first mako of the season a 193lb. specimen. The story is different from our eastern crew. During the early part of July, Captain Jim Krug aboard his vessel Persuader accompanied by his proven crew of Bobby and Jack and a friend bested a 591 lb. Thresher Shark. The large whiptail was taken after a prolonged four and a quarter hour battle, highlighted by several blistering runs that nearly spooled the reel several times.

There have been consistent reports from our inshore trollers

reporting catches of school-sized bluefin tuna as well as mahi mahi and skipjack tuna. The action has been concentrated over a rather large body of water at the 20-fathom mark, start trolling with small lures and you might be rewarded for your efforts.

On the local front fluking has been fair at best, however if you are targeting a big one this past month many of our members have been scoring with fish that range in the 5-8lb class. Drifting around local wrecks or employing live bait have proven deadly on these larger fluke. During an early July outing club member Mike Sullivan landed as many as 75 fish, keeping their limit up to 8 1/2 lbs.

The local fishing for striped bass has been fairly consistent this year to date. We were rewarded with almost daily action on the bunker schools that spanned from Fire Island Inlet – East Rockaway Inlet. However our eastern crew tells a slightly larger story, to the tune of 51.3 lbs. This trophy bass was taken last week once again by Captain Jim Krug aboard his new downeaster "Persuader". What a way to christen a new boat. Congratulations on your trophy.

Bluefishing has been at its best as well. 17 Fathoms has been the hot area for the last month and the fish are showing no signs of letting up. Bunker Chum and cut bait are the ticket to cashing in on this action.

As the month of August wears on we can target a multitude of species, get out there and enjoy the action.

FTC DOCKAGE WAITING LIST

In an effort to ensure fairness in managing the property waiting list, the Board of Directors adopted the following set of rules at its June meeting:

Rules for the "waiting list"


- The business manager will be the official keeper of the waiting list
- Any member wishing to be on the waiting list will post a \$100 deposit.
- The deposit is refundable at any time.
- The receipt of the deposit, by the business manager, will initiate placement on the list on a "first come first serve" basis[1].
- The member must designate, in writing, which type slip they want at the time that they give a deposit. Slips designations are:
- width: 10,11,12,13,14 or any combination
- Floating dock, non-floating dock or no preference.
 Slip designations must be in writing and may be revised at any time by notifying the business manager, in writing.
- When a slip becomes available that meets their requirements, the next person on the list will be asked to submit their boat for review by the Property Committee to determine its "sea worthiness." Vessels determined to be "not sea worthy" by the committee because they rep resent a risk to the club may be rejected.
- If a slip meeting the requirements is offered between November 1 and January 31, and it is refused, the \$100 deposit will be returned and the person's name will be removed from the list.
- If a slip meeting the requirements is offered between February 1 and October 31, and it is refused, it will be offered to the next person on the list. The person refusing the slip will remain on the list in their prior position.
- If you wish to place a deposit for a spot on the waiting list, see Mike Sullivan.
