

FISHING BULLETIN

ith the month of August at our doorstep, one could say that we are definitely in season. Our fisheries both inshore and offshore have opened up and our members are embracing it with open arms. The weather has been on our side the last several weeks, with some luck and

maybe a prayer, let's hope that it continues for many more. NOAA has revised their Tropical storms and Hurricane predictions for this season downward and with a little more luck hopefully we can continue to enjoy what we wait all year for without the horrendous conditions that precipitate there arrival.

The relatively slow start has taken on a different face recently. A large body of yellowfin has taken up residence around the area of the Dip and the action has been real hot. For most boats that have made the trip they have reported excellent action with fish up to 65lbs. This has been a troll bite and our members have reported many "fire drills" on the multiple hookups taking place daily. Congratulations are in order for all of the FTC boats that participated in the 50th Anniversary Babylon Invitational. Our own Captain Sil of the Camille was able to capture second place in the overnight division. His 85lb. Yellowfin enabled the crew to cash in on a substantial Calcutta prize. Club member Jeff Yapalater wasn't sure which team he was playing on so he fished the day division aboard a Babylon based boat and reported excellent action and a second place prize as well. Congratulations again on a great job by all who participated.

The areas shark fishing has fallen into its typical summertime doldrums. Not many members are targeting them now but for those who have, report a lot of small makes up to 100.0lbs. Most of this action has been in the areas of 20-25 fathoms of water. Our 2006 Shark Season has been excellent with some very nice quality fish being taken to date.

On the local fishing front the word is Fluke. Do you remember how to spell that? Finally a body of fish has started to show themselves. The action had been concentrated further to the east off of Fire Island but recently the action has been reported in the area of our local reef with fish reported to 8.0lbs. Bluefish have taken a firm hold as well. Action from Cholera to the Three Sisters on bait and chum has been very productive. Seabass action has picked up as well with many of the not so often hit spots giving up quality fish.

Striped bass action has fallen into a slower period as well. Although the western drops continue to produce fish the action is far short of the way it has been.
