

FISHING BULLETIN

Our summer has transitioned into the month of August and the relatively dry spring and early summer season has helped to catalyze one of the best offshore seasons in many years. Our inshore fishery remains solid and it is being enjoyed by all who are taking advantage of it as well.

Our offshore scene has been heating up for some time now and leading the charge has been Capt. Chris Gerhart aboard his Wasabi. They have been racking up a few noticeable catches lately during their trips to the Hudson Canyon. During a recent trip; club members Peter Cefai and Bobby Hindenlang enjoyed big eye tuna action to 150lbs as well as white and blue marlin action and a nice pile of yellowfin tuna to round out the catch. following that trip up a few days later Capt. Chris, Jimmy Meehan, Bobby Krug and Bobby Hindenlang enjoyed a successful overnighter as Bobby bested a 100lb class swordfish on 30lb class tackle while pitching a bait to a few yellowfin tuna that were circling beneath the boat. One dozen yellowfin tuna also made their way home in the fish hold as well as a smattering of tilefish and mahi.

Our club is made up of many unselfish anglers always looking to provide information towards fellow club members; Paul Notto is certainly deserving of this recognition as he recently called in myself and fellow club member Chris Gerhart during a recent lack luster overnight tuna trip and helped us bail out our trips as we were both able to cash in on some classic yellowfin tuna trolling action between the Dip and the Hudson Canyon in 100 fathoms of water.

Offshore but a little closer to home the Bluefin tuna action continues as well. Although the action has been decent as of lately; around the vicinity of the Atlantic Princess wreck to the Chicken Canyon fish in the 50-80lb class have been caught on both jigs and bait. Also recently a few yellowfin tuna have been making their presence known north of the canyons. From the Bacardi Wreck to the Texas Tower Wreck area both Yellowfin and Bluefin Tuna have surfaced during the right conditions and fish to 80lbs have been caught both trolling and jigging.

On the local fishing front on the menu as of late has been fluke and some really strong reports are coming in from our passionate anglers who are working it and cashing in on it.

From the 70 foot depths out to the 85 foot depths and mostly on structure decent catches of fluke and seabass are being taken on a daily basis when the right conditions are present. Club vessels Bly Sky, Crazy G, The Betty, Split Shot, Kristen, Widget, Fish and White Tails and Mary Etta amongst many others have reported real quality fluke to 9.5 lbs and seabass to 4.0 lbs. Out east from Montauk, club members Jim Krug and Anthony Testa have reported excellent action on striped bass, fluke and seabass over the last several weeks of fishing.

TYING KNOTS TYING KNOTS, NAUTICAL MILES, AND LATITUDE - TOGETHER




My GPS indicated a speed of 22 knots recently. I had heard that the term "knot" had something to do with an old way to measure speed with a piece of rope, and knew that 1 knot was equal to 1 nautical mile per hour, but what exactly was a nautical mile? Looking it up today, you can easily find that it is equal to approximately 1852 meters or

6076 ft. (versus 5280 feet for a statute mile). Why did someone come up with this, and what is the significance of the length of one nautical mile?

The answers lie in history and the concept of latitude and longitude which can be traced back to Eratosthenes in the third century BC. It was he who first proposed a system to determine location using angular measurements. Much later on, when it was determined that the earth rotated on it's axis it was established that latitude would represent the angle measured

from the equator to an objects position on earth. The latitude at the equator was to be 0 degrees, +90 degrees at the north pole and – 90 at the south. Angles were commonly measured in degrees, which could be broken down into minutes and seconds for finer resolution. (each degree equals 60 minutes, each minute equals 60 seconds).



As the science of mapping or cartography emerged degrees and minutes of latitude were frequently indicated on the side of a chart. Wouldn't it be convenient if this scale could be used to measure distance? It was determined that each degree of latitude would represent 1 nautical mile. So, by taking dividers and measuring the distance between two points on a chart, you could easily determine the distance in nautical miles by placing the dividers against the minutes of latitude scale. (this does not work for longitude which varies greatly, based upon latitude). All very convenient, but in actuality how long was this nautical mile, and how long would it take to sail between two points?

In 1791 it was decreed by the French Academy of Science that a length of measurement called the "meter" was to be equal to 1/10,000,000 (one ten millionth) of the distance from the equator to the north pole. Therefore, one ten millionth of a meter represented 90 degrees of latitude which equaled (90x60) 5,400 minutes of latitude or 5,400 nautical miles. If you do the math, it turns out that 1 nautical mile equals approximately 1,852 meters. Knowing distance was good, but how long would it take to travel that distance? They needed to know how fast they were moving.

To determine speed in nautical miles per hour early navigators used a weighted quarter circle of wood attached to a line called a "chip log". The chip log was thrown in the water and at the same instant a 30 second "hourglass" was up-ended (30 seconds was more convenient than an hour). The line attached to the chip log had a series of knots along it's length. As the ship moved away, the weighted board remained nearly stationary as the number of knots paid out in thirty seconds was counted by a crew member. The ships speed in "knots" was now known. To setup the line they knew that 1 knot = 1 nautical mile per hour = 1852 meters per hour = 15.43 meters per 30 seconds. Therefore if you put a knot in the rope every 15.43 meters, one nautical mile per hour "1 knot" would be made for each knot counted in 30 seconds. A strong yank on the line caused a breakaway to trip so the chip log could be retrieved.

These methods served early navigators well but were only close approximations. The earth is not a perfect sphere, time could not be measured accurately, and the chip log did not remain truly stationary in the water. Some navigators used a 28 second hourglass which changed the knot spacing accordingly. The history and evolution of navigation is easily lost while we take for granted the precise navigation instruments we use today. Anyway, that's how knots, nautical miles and degrees of latitude are tied together......


