FISHING REPORT

Summer Pattern Unfolds

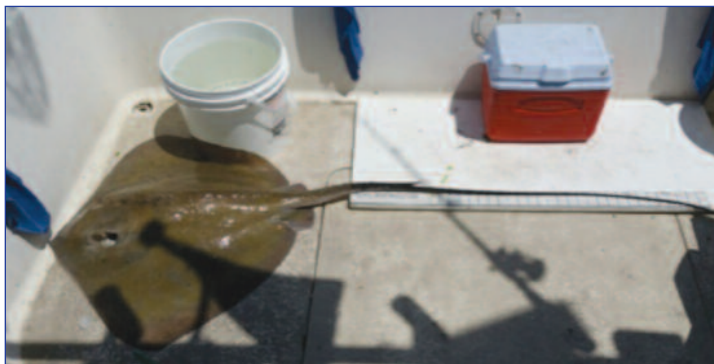

On the inshore scene, the long awaited July 15th seabass opener started with a bang with nice sized fish reported on all the pieces from 40 - 100 ft. I took my Emily S out to some 90 ft. structure looking for fluke. Fluking was impossible since the seabass and ling were all over my offerings. Want ling ? try gulp ... More recently, my kids and I enjoyed non-stop action with quality fluke and seabass from 55 ft. structure on out to the Hempstead Reef. Nick Nero took his Dolce Vita to the reef with Sean Libby, the two easily limited with nice fluke

working the hard bottom. The Hempstead Reef has experienced a great run of fish with many boats easily limiting out on fluke with some nice seabass as a bycatch. Joe Mangiapanello had a banner day on his Crazy G working some deeper drops in the 75 to 85 foot range south of Jones Inlet. One memorable day they "had all the three pound fish you wanted", with Joe's father in law landing an 8.25 lb beauty along with a couple of 6.5 lbers. Not to be outfished, Joe regained the upper hand when he decked a whopping 9 lb. 14 oz. fluke. Very nice catch Mr. Crazy G, you had quite the July as we will see !

While fluking in the bay, Dr. John J. Webber Jr. hooked up with a mystery fish that pushed his Ugly Stick to the limit. After a prolonged battle, the fish turned out to be a stingray and was carefully landed, photographed and released aboard his Miss Beahavin III.

Our south shore bass have apparently worked their way east to Montauk. Team CPA (John Daum, Frank Faber, and Tim Sherman), the Irish Giant (Brian Doherty) and Joe Mangiapanello (Crazy G) fished with Capt. Tom on the Grand Slam. Fluking was a slow pick and they switched to bass. Good move, over 40 bass were landed, all in the 20 - 40 lb class. According to Brian, "Tim proved his fishing

proress by showing the crew that he could not catch fish on either side of the boat as well as the stern." Don't shoot the messenger ...



Working our way offshore, shark fishing slowed a bit from it's torrid pace, with a typical summer pattern developing into a mix of blue, brown, dusky, hammerhead and smaller makos and threshers, making appearances from just off the beach out to the 20 fathom curve and throughout the mudhole. Chris Bellinzoni pointed his Four Bells toward the twenty mile wreck area with a crew of Steve Valenti and Al Casciano . They set up and had life in the slick all day consisting of a couple of free jumping makos, mahi-mahi, and tinker mackerel. They tagged and released a couple of female makos, and released a blue. Al Casciano was on the rod for a 115 lb. male mako that took a ride home with them, destined for the grill. Maybe the tinkers were drawn to the chum, everything else to the tinker mackerel? Both tinker and boston mackerel have been abundant, could explain some of the good fishing we've experienced this year.

Bluefin have been active along the 30 fathom curve in the area of the Coimbra. Fish have been taken primarily on the troll with some on jigs. Our Editor, Captain John Jutt ran several trips offshore on his Red Dawn Rising. On a trip to the Coimbra area, Capt. John reported Bluefin on the troll up to 80 Lbs. A separate trip to the Hudson Canyon resulted in a yellowfin, several nice mahi and a white marlin that was brought to the boat and released.

Captain Chris Gerhart of the Wasabi reports a great canyon season so far, lots of YFT up to 90 lbs, a few bigeye, bunch of big mahi, some LFT, tilefish and a 125 lb swordfish. Past trip they had a 220 lb. bigeye, nice LFT and a smaller YFT. Chris said it was, "slow, but we got a good one". Indeed you did. The trip before Capt. Chris reported that they had "30 bites, landed 25, kept 17, all 50-80 lb. YFT, all on the troll in one afternoon", fire up the grill, tuna time Wasabi style !

FLUKE CALCUTTA

Joe Mangiapanello is once again leading the Fluke Calcutta. My hat is off to him. Joe beat Dr. John Weber's leading fish by 2 oz. with a 9lb. 14 oz. fish that he captured on July 6 sailing out of Jones Inlet aboard his own boat the Crazy G. You may recall that Joe bested Dr. Weber's son John III's 10lb. 8oz. fish last year when he boated an 11lb. 4oz. fluke that would eventually take the 2013 Calcutta.. So far, 77 members have joined the 2014 Calcutta. Entry fee is \$10-- winner take all. Fish may be caught from any port during the regular NY fluke season. All fish must be alive and free swimming at the time it is caught with hook and line. See Mike Sullivan or Charlie Goldstein if you wish to join.

PROPERTY

- Summer dockage, April 1st to October 31: \$85 per ft with a minimum of \$ 2150 for boats under 25 ft.
- Winter storage \$14 per foot with a minimum of \$300. Rate is the same for in water storage.
- Freezer fee is \$175
- Late removal of boats from the property will be billed @\$150 per month after June 1st.
- Remote gate openers are available with a deposit of \$40.
- Grandfathered trailers must summer and winter in the marina, They are: Mike Wagner, Don Granger, Joe Polly, Ken Kapner, Bob Schmid.
- Summer trailer storage is discouraged, but if you have a boat in the marina, trailer storage will be \$250 for the summer season.
- Our marina is looking good at this point in time. All the dock tower lights are now on and the electric company has been notified about the pole lights that need bulbs.

Please do not drop things off at the marina without first checking with someone on the property committee; Bob Sabella, Allan Evelyn, Don Granger, Charlie Goldstein.

Things that appear without notification will promptly find their way to the dumpster.

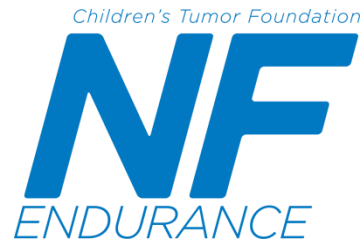

Despite the challenges and everything that Timmy and his family have been through, he continues to be an enthusiastic, sweet and funny little man. Although NF has been overwhelming his family remains hopeful by seeing all good things the Children's Tumor Foundation does and the ongoing new research that is developing.
