July Fishing Warm Water and Winds of Change

July started off with striped bass still abundant on the West End. With the warm water, striped bass has slowed down to the west and locally. Tremendous live bait and jig fishing has been reported at Montauk. The body of fish we had along the South Shore has definitely moved East. Bunker remain super abundant off our beaches and swimming unmolested. Twice in July, while running out of Jones Inlet I saw dolphins right in front of the inlet, a good indicator that the water has just about peaked in temperature.



Fluke fishing locally started off so/so, with some fish available everywhere but numbers and size lacking in any particular location.

Montauk has been a different story, with hot fluking seemingly since the season opened. Earlier in the month, Ken "Fishing Frenzy" Donowski reported: "South Shore fishing has been extremely difficult, just a lack of fish! If you are looking to score

on quality fish I suggest going east to Shinnecock or if you are a traveling angler I suggest Montauk's South Side where loads of quality fish have been coming over the rails. I fished the Miss Montauk on July 8th scoring my limit with two quality fish weighing in at 9.72 and 9.86 pounds." Nice going! Ken is no stranger to large fluke and had an 11 plus a couple of years ago on the same boat. My guess is he'll be back again.

I am happy to report that it seems a new body of fluke has moved into the West End, and limits are generally available if you put in the effort. The usual spots have produced, but the inshore reefs may currently hold the edge over the deeper structure like the Cholera Middle Grounds etc. My afternoon trip on Friday, July 28th had quality fishing with an easy limit of nice fish on the Hempstead Reef, with several 19" plus fish being released. Locally, August is generally our best month of fluking, let's hope it holds up.

Bottom fishing has been excellent with mixed bag action on seabass, porgies, ling, and triggers. Porgy fishing throughout the island has been described as "best in years." On my last afternoon fluke excursion, while running out the inlet I saw



Mike Zullo coming in. Later that evening we compared notes. Captain Mike reports: "Reef is loaded with BIG porgies. Nice mixed bag fishing. Fished three hours had seabass limit (no big deal) two triggers, and kept 15 porgies over two lbs. Must have caught 75 porgies and as many seabass, couple of ling too." That sounds like some good action and good eating. Note that Mike and I both experienced very good fishing on the day right before the NE blow that occurred Saturday. A word to the wise should suffice...

Shark fishing seems down this year, reports have been scarce. A large "inshore" thresher was landed recently and with any luck these fish could settle in on the bunker which are plentiful from 30' on out.

Nick Nero ran his Dolce Vita S/E for a combo bottom/shark trip. Bottom fishing was slow in the deep with a couple of ling and seabass for the cooler. On the shark drift, they managed a small make (released) and a nice mahi, which

took the ride home.

Throughout most of July, a good Bluefin bight remained in the Texas Tower vicinity, with mixed Bluefin available on the troll, and fish up to 150 lbs reported. Captain John Jutt, fresh off the 100 lb plus BFT reported last month made another trip to the same area on his Red Dawn Rising. An evening troll was unproductive, they set up for shark overnight and were able to jig fresh mackerel for bait. A rod started screaming and the initial thought was that a nice mako had taken the bait.



After a fight, a nice Bluefin appeared in the lights and a 62 inch/100 lb plus fish was brought to gaff and landed. The next morning, several other mixed BFT were trolled up with a boat limit retained making for an excellent trip.

Many captains have reported that these tuna have been avoiding plastics, preferring ballyhoo on the popular Joe Chute Rigs. A week or so later, some fish were reported further East, out to the Coimbra area. Of late, the BFT bight seems to have dwindled.

Reports from the Canyon areas have been scare. I just heard of a nice catch of Yellowfin from the Fishtails area. August is the month when canyon fishing generally stabilizes and breaks open. Here's hoping for good weather and great fishing looking ahead.


