


Bob Pandy and I did a mega trip out of Hyannis, MA, scoring our limits of large fluke for both days, with Bob scoring a 9.9lb fluke.

STRIPER DIARIES | EPISODE 15

With all the buzz of Blue Fin Tuna around, especially within reach, all I could think about was finally heading into "the deep." With a 23ft. center console and a single engine, I knew that picking the perfect weather window would be crucial. Time to grab a nautical chart, check Terrafin and

some other local websites.

After diligently researching, I decided Sunday, July 14, 2019, looked perfect. With that in mind, I spent my entire Saturday getting ready. Bait, ice, food, fuel, safety gear, and tackle. For offshore trolling, I rely upon a set of four (4) Penn International 16VSX reels, spooled with 100lb. Jerry Brown Spectra and 125 yard top shot of 80lb. Jinkia Mono. The reels are paired with Sea Isle 6 foot standup composite rods, with Fuji SIC guides and AFTCO reel seats. I also like to have a pair of jigging rods on board. My favorite set-ups are the Penn Torque 30's paired with the Shimano Trevala jigging rods. Finally, a spinning set up is a must. I rely on the Stella 8000 reel with 65 lb spectra and a fluorocarbon top shot mated to a custom Stalker Outfitter rod.

Pete and I headed out of Jones Inlet at first light, as I plugged the numbers of the Virginia into my Garmin 7610. The ride out was a disaster. How is that possible, I kept thinking. The ocean was rough and choppy and I kept thinking how are we going to make it 41 miles. With all the preparation that had taken place, the last thing I wanted to do was stop. At roughly 19 miles, I slowed the boat and decided to make sure it was smart to continue. Truth is, I was having second thoughts. We were running "safety drills" and "what ifs" in our heads. Not good. After a few curse words, I made the decision to turn back. It was rough and I was pissed. We steamed straight to Richie's Fishing Station to refill the 30 gallons of fuel I burned on our 38 mile boat ride. We also motored to Fred Chall Marine Supply and purchased a second ACR "ResQlink" Epirb that I could attach to my body, with additional safety gear. With the boat fully loaded, the plan was to head home, get some sleep, and head back out at first light.

We woke up Monday morning with enthusiasm (Another sick day at work). It was time to catch a Tuna. As the sun peaked



out we approached the JI Buoy. The water was glass. Yippie! Okay, 41 miles to go. We took turns driving while eating egg sandwiches. When we hit the 30 mile mark something strange happened. The ocean turned into a washing machine. All of a sudden

the waves were out of the northeast. It was rough and sloppy. We just couldn't believe our eyes. Without another boat in sight it was eerie, but there was no turning back. Finally, after 10 miles we saw 3 boats in the distance!! We must be getting close! As we approached, I heard 2 guys on the radio. One guy stated that he was from "Sandy Hook" and the other from "Jones." I quickly grabbed the radio and said "hey I am out of Jones. How are we going to get home in these conditions." He responded, "slowly," but then said the weather "should lay down" and



that "I was welcome to follow him home if I wanted." Very nice gesture. I have heard of having a "buddy boat" when going offshore, but I never seriously considered it before. It's probably not a bad idea.

Pete worked the deck and within minutes the lines were in the water as the waves crashed over the bow. We trolled 6 rods and every few minutes I would yell "Hold on" as we went up and down over the swell. This was not ideal. Within 5 minutes we heard line peeling off the reel. Fish on! Since it was just us, we scrambled to reel in the other lines and keep the boat in gear. Hmmmm maybe bringing an extra person would have been a good idea. The first fish hit on a purple daisy chain, that I typically use trolling for Dorado. It was a 28 inch blue fin! Keeper!

With the spread back out we continued to troll in some very rough conditions. Within minutes the reel began to scream and Pete yells out again "Fish on! "The fish hit a Sterling green spreader bar! Every time we trolled past a bunch of "tuna chicks" we landed a fish. It was incredible. The next fish hit a white wide tracker. All of the fish were in the 27-28 inch range. But that didn't matter. They were blue fin, and we caught them!!

By 1:30pm we decided to head back. It was still very rough and I had actually puked over the rail several times. A rare occurrence. We programmed in Jones Inlet and hit "go." The first 10 miles were sloppy. Then all of a sudden the heavens opened up and the ocean was GLASS. Thank God. Time to lay down on the "bean bag" and take a nap from dehydration. Pete navigated the whole way home.

By the time we broke the Jones Inlet is was 4:30 p.m. and was time to wash the boat and hit the hay.

Until our next adventure. Tight lines.
