FISHING BULLETIN

We are entering the final month of the summer and the doldrums will rapidly be coming to an end. For most of we look forward to this time of the year when our offshore species start to take note of the changing



dates on the calendar. On the offshore scene Capt Chris Gerhart and Capt Adam Bollaci skippered their vessels back to the Bluefin tuna grounds, south west of the Coimbra wreck in 195 feet of water, on a Sunday in mid August and landed on the mother load of tuna. These fish were caught jigging. John Payne reported that a recent trip to the Hudson Canyon yielded a pair of bigeye tuna in the mid one hundred pound class as well as a smattering of smallish yellowfin. Pete DiThomas and Joe Mangiapanello sailed from Manasquan NJ to the Bluefin grounds and reported an insane bite. They landed 25 fish out of 35 hooked keeping their limit and releasing the rest. I skippered the Blue Marlin to the same grounds this past Friday, after three days of east wind, and landed 14 out of 20 that were hooked up with the largest in the 100lb class. Capt Chris Squeri was out on the same day aboard the Lady E and reported the same action. On an interesting note I received a call from Capt John Jutt, he along with his crew made an overnight trip to these grounds and reported a very successful evening of playing catch and release with Bluefin tuna. These fish were landed on bait. Please take note that there is currently an enforcement effort by the various agencies regarding the harvesting of Bluefin Tuna. Bruce Forester was boarded by the DEC five miles offshore, he was in compliance. If you think that it will not happen to you, think again the rewards are not worth the risk.

On the local fishing front, fluke currently remains on the menu. Strong reports are coming in from our dedicated group of sinker bouncers who are working feverishly on landing a double digit fluke in order to clinch their shot of taking the famed Fluke Calcutta. The 80 foot depths and mostly on structure laden bottom haven given up the most recent catches of fluke and seabass. Over the last several days it has been a foot race and most recently Don Granger took the lead with an 8.7 lb. fish only to have that taken away the very next day as he put Bob Sabella onto a 9.0 lb fish. Concurrently out in Montauk, Anthony Testa Jr. landed his personal best, a 9.0 lb fish the very same day as Bob Sabella. With a week to go and a huge storm looming, should make for a very interesting finish to this seasons fishery. Also from Montauk, Capt Jim Krug reported that earlier in the month the bass fishing was on fire evidenced by the 48 lb. fish which graced his fish box on the way home.

Fishing in the back bays continues to come alive and I recently had an invitation to accompany local plugging expert Capt Barbara Solomon and trusted first mate Peter Cefai. After arriving at our location, I took note of the techniques that were being employed. I thought this attention to detail would help and aid in my success that evening. I attached my surface popper and proceeded to make cast after cast while I watched Barbara school me in the art of casting and then catching. Final tally that night was a goose egg for me and one school bass and six bluefish to ten pounds taken by her. I threatened to sell the Blue Marlin and all of my offshore gear, buy a skinny water boat and ultra light spinning tackle in order to be ready for the next challenge.

CONSERVATION

In mid-August the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council voted to increase the 2011 harvest levels for both fluke and porgies. The Porgy quota was increased from 17.09 million pounds to 24.1 million pounds, and fluke from 25.48 million pounds to 33.95 million pounds.

These quotas apply to both commercial and recreational catches. The impact of these increases on size and bag limits for next year won't be known until the harvest level for this year is calculated by the Marine Recreational Fishing Statistical Survey (MRFSS). However, it seems that there is a glimmer of hope that next year may bring a longer season, smaller size limit, or larger bag limit.



TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The Woodcleft Fluke Tournament ends this weekend with the seasonal close of the fishery.
