See you on the water or in the woods!



Fishing Report

Summer and Fish are Moving Right Along



Peanut bunker and snappers are in the canals and the "named" storms have appeared on our weather maps. Labor Day weekend is just ahead and most kids are back in school. Summer is winding down and the fish seem to be on the move.

Early in August, Captain Barbara Solomon did a trip on her new, yet unnamed Everglades where she reported "limits" of seabass, lots of ling, chub mackerel, and many keeper sized blackfish (released) fishing a "twenty mile wreck." Nick Nero had a similar trip with some keeper fluke in the mix too, fishing the Middle Grounds.

Fluking remains lackluster for most. Nearly all of the reports I have heard revolve around fishing the hard bottom from the Angler Banks, Middle Grounds, and east to Cholera. Limits are possible but you need to work hard. Fluke over 7 lbs. seem few and far between. Our esteemed President, Ray Geiger reported on a Sunday trip to the Cholera with Paul Cunningham and his nephew, the current FTC Duke of Fluke Calcutta leader, Kenny Donowski. They encountered

very tough conditions with little wind and light tides. Eventually, they found a nice pocket of fish near a pot. Kenny ended up with 5 keepers for the day and El Presidente had 2, including a nice 6 lb. pool winner.

My boat went in for some scheduled maintenance (and some unscheduled), so I had not fished for a couple of weeks. With the boat squared away I was able to get in a couple of fluke trips. Scott Novick joined me on a weekday jaunt fishing the Middle Grounds for 7 keepers to about 6 lbs. That following Saturday I went solo and ran off and away from the large fleet gathering at Cholera and vicinity. Fishing the hard stuff in over 100' of water I limited out pretty easily with nice fluke. Ling were thick out there, seabass were conspicuously absent both trips though a couple were taken. Fluke appear to be on the move with this past full moon, time to "make hay" as the saying goes. Porgies are available on all the inshore pieces. Cod seemed to have been thinned out on all but the deepest / most select offshore pieces.

Bluefish have made appearances with blitzes occurring within and just outside Jones Inlet. One day there were reports of 100 lb. class BFT feeding on the blues within sight of the JI. A mix of hammerheads, blues, and brown sharks are available just about everywhere from 60' on out. Summertime makos seem scare this year.

Good canyon reports were hard to come by unless you were one of the boats fortunate enough to run into some BET. Earlier in the month some BET and YFT were reported by those trolling into the night and at first dawn, and on the chunk overnight. Our Editor,

Captain John Jutt ran his Red Dawn Rising to the deep where they were frustrated on the troll having some boats hook up with BET nearby while they looked on. Overnight, they hooked and landed a nice YFT. The next day up on the troll a large Blue Marlin took a liking to, and struck their bird teaser, pulling and eventually parting the running line (not the lure leader). They were able to retrieve their floating bird / lure combo so I guess the marlin swam away none the worse.

More recently, it seems on overnight chunk bite has developed primarily in the Hudson. I've heard several reports of boats striking out on the troll but able to chunk mixed YFT, BET, and some swordfish during the overnight. Nick Nero took his 25' Parker Dolce Vita on a day troll to the deep with venerable crew member Pete Cefai. They worked their way from the Bacardi south to the Elbow, across the deep and back towards the Tip. The only highlight off the trip was a large unseen denizen of the deep that struck and quickly spooled a 50W on full strike before they could give chase....




