A new roof was installed on the compressor shed by Alfredo who keeps his truck at the property. The insurance inspection was completed last Thursday and we should be good to go. Lots of things happening at the marina, we had several boats sold and it looked like we have some slips open for next season. However, through word of mouth by several members, we've already filled most of the slips with new members who joined the club to get a slip and in most cases winter storage as well. Just a reminder next year's rate will be \$80 per foot for summer dockage. Now, the good news on how to negate that increase and save money to boot. As we did this year if you pay your bill in full by the first payment date you will receive a 5% discount. We are currently looking into solutions for ripping up the walkways in an effort to get get them leveled and resurfaced. Stay tuned, our property is our biggest asset and it should be our showpiece.

FISHING REPORT

Finally, fishing has heated up on the fluke grounds both local and to the east there was solid action with many nice keepers. The highlights of the fluke bite started when Mike Sullivan marched into the lead of the Duke of Fluke with an impressive 10.42 lb doormat. Unfortunately, his time at the top was not long as Scott Novick took the lead with a 11.3lb fish.

The local reefs and wrecks have all had solid action with sea bass and porgies. Now that we are in September the bag limits have changed make sure you know the limits before sailing - https://www.dec.ny.gov/outdoor/7894.html

Offshore we have had a great bluefin bite that has lasted most of the summer and is still going strong, from the Coimbra to the Bacardi solid catches are still being reported. For the first time in a while there has been a Yellowfin bite inshore of the canyon. These fish have been biting for about a month and have been caught chunking and trolling. Days with less boat traffic have seen better catches so getting out mid-week is the way to go if you can. As for the canyons there have been some big bigeyes being caught but action with the yellowfin has been slow. Tilefish have been plentiful as well as mahi on the pots.



STRIPER DIARIES EPISODE 23

Mixed Bag. This time of year is notorious for catching a wide range of fish. With water temps in the mid 70s and blue water as close as 8-10 miles out, anything is possible. This means preparation the night before includes trolling tackle, light gear, and an array of different bait and jigs. The plan was to stop at the Cholera, take a look and keep heading south. As

we loaded the boat and started the motor, we encountered a minor hiccup. The engine would not go down. Time to take out the tool box. Luckily, a big screwdriver was enough to manually lower the motor, but not having the capability to raise and lower the motor is not ideal. After a delayed start, we headed out of Jones Inlet. The water was beautiful and wind was light. The plan was to target sea bass, since on September 1, the regulations allow seven (7) fish per person at 15 inches. We motored to the Cholera and it was packed with boats, so we decided to head further south. After another 5 miles, we stopped on a ship wreck. Even though I had not fished this wreck in years, the plan was to drift with a 5oz. sinker and bait. The water was crystal clear, and the first drop was loaded with sea bass. Unbelievable! Each drop was better than the next. Within a short time, we loaded the cooler with double headers, and not another boat in site! Those days are rare and hard to come by.

Since the wind shifted to the south, producing a better drift, we decided to switch gears and target fluke. Fluke season ends September 30, so we knew we had to get in on the action. Time to switch rods and rigs. I like to fish for fluke with ultra light spinning gear. My Shimano Stradic 2500 is perfect with a high/low bucktail jig, topped off with spearing and squid. The first few drifts were slow. Maybe this wasn't a

good idea. As the tide turned, the fishing heated up. We caught several nice size fluke and some jumbo sea robbins, when all of a sudden Pete yells GRAB THE NET! I reached over and saw a giant fluke surface. Luckily I did not fumble the net and reached over to scoop up his fish. It was a gorgeous fatty at 25 inches and 6 pounds! Dinner! We continued to drift and fish with the



sun blazing on our faces. It was one of those lazy days that you didn't want to end. As the sun lowered, we knew it was time to head in. What a banner day, and great way to end the summer.

As September rolls in, the winds will typically turn east/northeast. That means the fall striped bass migration will soon be upon us. Let's hope this year is a good one!


