🥎 FISHING BULLETIN

The month of October is upon us and the

opportunity is gradually diminishing for planning an offshore trip. With the days starting to grow shorter, the window of weather necessary to enable a safe transit to and from the grounds has not being on our side recently, leaving many offshore chariots and there diehard crews tied to the dock. Flexibility is the

name of the game at this time of the year and an offshore window of weather is no more than 48 hours, due to the volatility of the ever changing weather forecasts. For those of us who have this option the rewards can be memories of a lifetime.

On the canyon scene, when the weather has allowed, our members have reported some excellent catches of yellowfin and longfin with an occasional sprinkling of a swordfish and the ever abundant mahi. The warm water had been concentrated at the south east corner of the Hudson but gradually took on a south westward movement and was parked from the southwest corner of the Hudson, offshore and west to Toms canyon. Reports of a dozen to two dozen fish an night were very common. Find the water, find the bait and the fish came on like gang busters. Our regular canyon commuters, Wasabi, Oceanic, Mikey Likes It all reported excellent catches when the weather allowed. Both trolling during the day and chunking at night were the methods that were employed.

Our anticipated arrival of the bluefin tuna schools around the offshore scallopers and draggers was a disappointment for most. As of the writing of this report, I have not heard of any fish that were caught or seen behind these commercial boats. If this action is to develop it will be a late season event. Be mindful of the bag limits that are in effect when targeting this species. The DEC has a larger team of enforcement officers this year and a good network of obtaining information so please be cognicent of your deci-

Closer to shore our fall shark fishery has gotten started, led by junior member Breden Errit. On a recent trip aboard uncle Matt Errit's, Nicki Ann he bested a 100lb class mako. The pressure is on Matty, the word is his brother is looking for one as well. Recently, Larry Festa ran his Kristen to an area on the thirty fathom curve for a day of fall sharking. Not long into the trip they hooked a monster of a mako and after several spirited leaps, twists and greyhounds the fish earned his freedom to fight another day. The action on these fall trips can be slow, however when the rod goes off get ready for a fish that can test the skills of the most seasoned offshore crews.

On the inshore scene, seabass have taken up the spotlight. Club members Bob Demeno, Paul Schuber have teamed up for some excellent action on the areas local wrecks. This past weekend Ken Kapner and his crew sailed further offshore and returned with a cooler full up to 5.0lbs. With the opening of the blackfish season upon us they to will find there way into the coolers of our club members. This fishery will continue to get better as the areas waters continue to cool down.

Bluefish continue with reckless abandon and have done so for quite some time. From 17 Fathoms west to the Mud Buoy the action can be non stop. Chumming and bait fishing will get you a limit catch in short order.

Lastly our fall striped bass run has begun. Several members have reported fish on bait in our local inlets and as the weather continues to cool down this fishery will only get better. The bunker schools are on the beach both east and west of our inlets, however the bass have not been reported to be on the schools as of yet. It is only a matter of time until the bass are on there heels.

Our board of directors meeting show some changes in the standards for which we can achieve awards. The board has approved a second exemption to the IGFA rules. Under the rules for Equipment: Section G sub. -1 has been amended as follows:

G. Hooks For Bait Fishing

Sub-1 for live or dead bait fishing no more than two single hooks may be used.

EXEMPT (voted 08/16/06 & grandfather to 01/15/06) Multiple hook rigs maybe used.

Example: "Jiggy's Rig"

For the upcoming season your Awards Committee will be reviewing all IGFA rules for changes or exemptions that may better serve our club and the way we fish.
