FISHING BULLETIN



J he month of September breezed past us as did many of the fishing days that we had planned for it. Mother Nature does not have any problem showing us who the real boss

is. Now with the month of October upon us the opportunity is gradually diminishing for planning an offshore trip. With the days starting to grow shorter, the window of weather necessary to enable a safe transit to and from the grounds has not being on our side recently, leaving many offshore chariots and there diehard crews tied to the dock. Flexibility is the name of the game at this time of the year and an offshore window of weather is no more than 48 hours, due to the volatility of the ever changing NOAA weather forecasts. For those of us who have this option the rewards can be memories of a lifetime.

On the canyon scene, when the weather has allowed, our members have reported some excellent catches of yellowfin tuna with an occasional sprinkling of a swordfish and the ever abundant mahi. The warm water had been concentrated at the south east corner of the Hudson. Our regular canyon commuter Wasabi on a recent overnighter reported a few yellowfin tuna and some big mahi that tipped the scales in the low 20 lb class. On the same Sunday/Monday overnighter the Oceanic reported an excellent catch of yellow fin in the 30lb class, they kept their legal limit and released the rest. The day time trolling has been spotty at best and the better action has been at night on the chunk; concurrently employing jigs when the fish make their appearance on the scope. Taking up the slack of our lack luster canyon bite has been our bluefin tuna fishery. Over the last two months the fish have been concentrated from the western part of the Glory Hole to the southwestern part of the Chicken Canyon. Our member have reported excellent action with the largest fish in the 100 lb class. John Jutt ran his new Red Dawn Rising on a very blustery Saturday and reported three hookups and three fish boated keeping his legal limit and releasing the other. The action has slowed recently in these areas and reportedly made up as our traditional fall fishery has, around the offshore scallopers and draggers. A break in the weather allowed a handful of FTC members to recently untie their boats and venture offshore in search of the fall bluefin. A blown NOAA forecast made for some sporty conditions during the day and for the transit home however while persistently engaged in fishing the fish did cooperate. Paul Noto ran his Rocket Fish accompanied by FTC members and reported nine hookups and two legal fish boated. They called in the Wasabi who was also able to get in on the action. Once on the drift they also had six hookups keeping their legal limit and tagging and releasing the rest. This action was reported in the vicinity of the Bacardi. Further to the east Bruce Forester ran his Oh Reely southwest of the Coimbra wreck and reported one 60lb bluefin and the same sea conditions for his ride home as well.

Closer to shore our fall shark fishery has been overshadowed by the bluefin bite. Within the next few weeks this fishery will kick into gear as these monsters of the deep start making their migration back through our area. The action on these fall trips can be slow, however when the rod goes off get ready for a fish that can test the skills of the most seasoned offshore crews.

On the inshore scene, seabass have taken up the spotlight. Club members Bob Demeno, Paul Schuber teamed up recently for some excellent action on the areas local wrecks in twenty fathoms of water. With the opening of the blackfish season upon us Nick Nero and Peter Cefai along with his dad reported a limit catch of fish to 5lbs. This fishery will continue to get better as the areas waters continue to cool down. Bluefish continue with reckless abandon and have done so for quite some time. From 17 Fathoms west to the Mud Buoy the action can be non stop. Chumming and bait fishing will get you a limit catch in short order.

Our passionate back bay anglers have also been making their mark. Pete DeThomas reported fifteen school size bass caught recently while casting with light spinning tackle. New club member Barbara Solomon has reported lots of action on her nearly daily evening fishing trips. A mix of bass and bluefish have been reported and a variety of fishing methods have been employed from clam chumming to casting plugs all of which have yielded success. Keep up the good work and keep the reports coming.

We will have slips available for anyone requesting summer dockage. To do so, get on our waiting list. In addition to keep our marina full each season boat slips may require some movement. We thank our current tenants for understanding.
